



Chief Executive Report MONTH, YEAR KEVIN KELLY Highlights The Members will be aware of the process of review of our capital grant funded projects commenced last year including the workshops held in each Municipal District and the priorities that were identified and a request from Council for a Quarterly Report. The first Quarterly Report on Capital Co-funded Projects has now been submitted to the Members. While this will be an item on future agendas it can be considered under the Chief Executives Management Report on this occasion There are a few key elements that I wish to bring to the Members attention: This is the first iteration of the report and it will evolve over time and these reports will be delivered at end March, June, September and December. It is expected that the overall issues including financing and resources will be considered at the plenary Council Meeting and thereafter some more detailed discussion on some projects would take place at the next Municipal District meeting following the Council Meeting. These projects would not be the subject of reports in between the Quarterly Reports The Report includes 77 projects which are underway and at various stages of the process of delivery, many of these will be delivered in 2022, and there are a further 34 projects which have been identified but are at an earlier stage. Many of these early stage projects have only a very preliminary cost estimate and in some cases no estimated cost and in many cases the precise project has yet to be defined. The progression of these projects will need to be prioritised as all cannot advance together and prioritisation will have regard to a number of issues including geographical spread. It is also assumed that there will be additional new projects under the smaller schemes such as Clar and TVR which have funding calls on an annual basis As with any capital project at present these are at risk from current construction cost inflation and this will need to be monitored and managed carefully in the coming period. This may impact not just on project cost but also on the viability of projects and the relevant Departments approach to assisting with such a **Dates to Note** scenario will be critical. The match funding requirement to be provided by Mayo Co Co which is currently estimated to be at €33m does not include any increase in construction costs, any additional costs for projects with a preliminary costing and any costs for projects not yet costed. The current figures for match funding requirement illustrate that co-funding already provided together with the future drawdown of loans already approved by Members (if approved by the Department) will still leave a

considerable funding gap which will need to be considered in the context of revenue budget provisions and also the contribution to these projects from Local Property Tax. Future projects will only be advanced where there is certainty about the source and availability of our co-funding element.

The next Quarterly Report will be delivered for the end of September but in the interim I intend to have discussion with the Members on the critical issues including the prioritisation of projects and bridging the funding gap.
