25th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR C) MASS DATES, TIMES & INTENTIONS

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY: Today 18th September 2022, Catholic Churches around the globe are celebrating Catechetical Sunday. Today is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. This year's theme is "This is my body given for you."

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The feast of St. Matthew the Apostle is celebrated on Wednesday next, 21st September. Matthew was a tax collector. It was strange that Jesus chose a tax collector a group despised by the Jews, as one of His apostles. Jesus declared "I have come to call, not the self-righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:13). Jesus was a friend of tax collectors and of sinners. Matthew wrote his Gospel for his own people, the Jews, to prove to them that Jesus of Nazareth was the Messiah spoken of by the Old Testament Prophets. He suffered a violent death joyfully in honour of Jesus.

BE CAREFUL what you do in the garden. The potatoes have eyes; the corn has ears and the beanstalk.

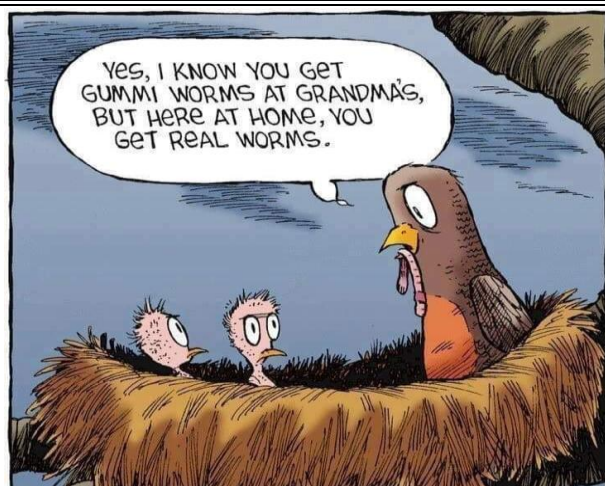
I TURNED DOWN A JOB where I'd be paid in vegetables. However the celery was just unacceptable.

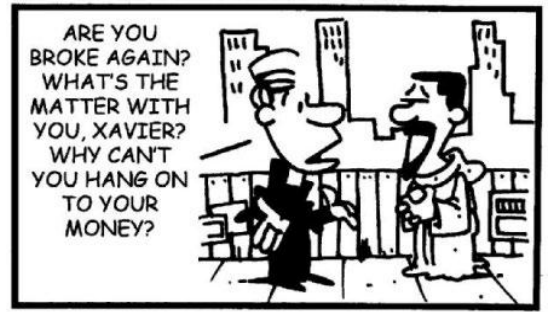

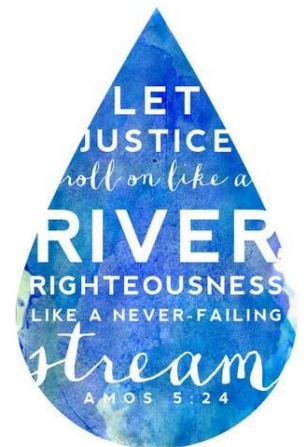
A MESSENGER OF GOD: The prophet Amos was similar to the prophets of the Old Testament in some ways and quite different in others. He was a common man; a farmer. He began his working life as a shepherd. Like many people he was disturbed by the conditions in his country. The ordinary people were suffering, ground down by an oppressive class system. The rich were becoming richer at the expense of the poor. He believed that God did not want a worship separated from honest human dealings.

Amos was simply minding his own business when God called him to preach. Amos came straight to the point and informed people that God does not overlook judgment. Here he is telling the people, "Hey I did not want to do this anymore than you want to hear it." Amos teaches us that there is always a place for a dedicated messenger of God.

Amos indeed was a square peg in a round hole. He did not train to be a prophet, but spoke from Words told to him by God. Isn't it great that God does not examine credentials before selecting someone to do his work.

God loves us. He wants us to be happy, to experience joy in our lives. Will there be sadness? Yes, sometimes. God never allows us to be burdened with more than we can handle. We must trust in

Him and allow him to take care of us. He will. For the more we try to control our lives the more mistakes we make. God however is infallible, He does not make mistakes. He is in control. Only we can mess it up! But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream! Amos 5:4
