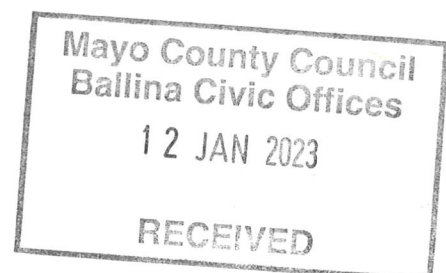


MAYO COUNTY COUNCIL
MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLINA
STREET PARKING AND CAR PARK BYE-LAWS, 2021

Long Title Mayo County Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of the powers vested on them by Section 101 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961 as amended by Section 6 of the Road Traffic Act, 1968 and in exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 36 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994, and having consulted the Commissioner of An Garda Síochána, hereby make the following bye-laws:

PART I
Preliminary

- Short Title 1 These bye-laws may be cited as the Mayo County Council Municipal District of Ballina Street Parking and Car Park Bye-Laws, 2021.
- Commencement 2 These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of July 2021.
- 3 The Ballina Town Council Street Parking Bye-laws, 2014 and the Mayo County Council Municipal District of Ballina Street Parking and Car Park Bye-Laws, 2018 are hereby revoked.
- Area of Application 4 These bye-laws apply to the area comprising the functional area of the former Ballina Town Council.
- Interpretation 5 In these bye-laws:
- “the Regulations of 1997” means the Road Traffic (Traffic and parking) Regulations, 1997 (SI No 182 of 1997) as amended;
- “the Signs Regulations of 1997” means the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997 (SI No 181 of 1997) as amended;



“agent” means any person employed by the Council or any other person authorised by the Council to carry out functions under these bye-laws and includes a Traffic Warden;

“authorised person” has the meaning assigned to it by Section 103(8) of the Road Traffic Act, 1961 as amended by Section 43 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994;

“buffer area” means an area between two parking bays shown as sign RRM 12 in the Signs Regulations of 1997;

“business hours” means the period from 9.30am to 6.30pm (09.30 to 18.30) on a weekday from Monday to Saturday which is not a holiday, except where otherwise indicated on:

- (i) an information plate accompanying traffic sign RUS 018 authorised by the Signs Regulations of 1997 in the ticket parking area where the vehicle is parked; or
- (ii) the appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine located on the public road or car park in which the vehicle is parked or on an adjacent public road or car park, where indicated on an information sign;

“bus stop” means an area on a public road being an area within which no vehicle other than a bus may park or stop shown by surface marking RRM 030 and bus stop sign RUS 031 in the Signs Regulations of 1997 and shown in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019).

“car park” means a car park shown on the Map annexed hereto and lettered “A” to “G”;

“disabled person’s parking bay” means a space intended for the parking of a vehicle in which is displayed a disabled symbol - shown as a sign or marking RRM 015 in the Signs Regulations of 1997 and shown in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019);

“disabled person’s permit” means a permit granted in accordance with Article 43 of the Regulations of 1997 as substituted by Article 3(c) of the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations, 2011;

“electronic means or electronic payment” means payment of a parking fee by electronic means (including payment by means of an app);

‘E-charging place’ means a place on a public road or car park where charging points have been installed and signed and marked for the charging of electric vehicles whilst parked shown by surface marking and sign RRM 034 and RUS 020a in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019);

“goods vehicle” means a vehicle used exclusively for the carriage of goods in the course of trade or business and taxed as a goods vehicle;

“holiday” means Good Friday or any day that is a public holiday for the purposes of the Organisation of Working Time Act, 1997;

“information plate” means a plate accompanying a traffic sign which indicates the period during which a restriction or prohibition indicated by such traffic sign applies;

“invalid parking ticket” means a parking ticket purchased at an appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine and which has either expired or is not displayed;

“loading bay” means an area in a ticket parking area and marked by road markings defined in Article 42 of the Signs Regulations of 1997 shown as sign RRM 009 in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019);

“parking bay” means a space on a public road or car park intended for the parking of a vehicle and so indicated by surface or other signs or markings RRM 011, RRM 016, RRM 013 and RRM 014 in the Signs Regulations of 1997 and shown in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019);

“parking fee” means a fee payable by parking ticket or by electronic means in accordance with these bye-laws for the parking of a vehicle;

“parking ticket” means a pay and display parking ticket which is issued by the Council by means of a pay and display parking ticket machine and which contains the following particulars:

- (a) the words “Ballina Municipal District”;
- (b) the fee paid in respect of the ticket;
- (c) the time of issue of the ticket;
- (d) the time and date of expiry of the ticket;

“Pay and Display parking ticket machine” means a machine capable of automatically delivering a parking ticket when the appropriate parking fee prescribed by these bye-laws is paid;

“public road or car park” means a road which is in the charge of Mayo County Council or in the case of a car park is controlled by Mayo County Council;

“taxi stand” means an area on a public road intended for the parking of licensed taxis and so indicated by surface or other sign or marking RRM 029 and taxi sign RUS 020 shown in the Signs Regulations of 1997 and shown in the Traffic Signs Manual (August 2019);

“ticket parking area” means an area on a public road or car park where traffic sign RUS 018 authorised by the Signs Regulations of 1997 together with an accompanying information sign indicating that parking of vehicles is subject to the exhibition of a pay and display parking ticket; or payment by electronic means;

“ticket parking place” means a place on a public road or car park where the parking of vehicles is subject to the exhibition of a valid parking ticket or payment of a parking fee by electronic means;

“traffic warden” has the meaning assigned to it by Section 2 of the Local Authorities (Traffic Wardens) Act, 1975 (No 14 of 1975) as amended;

“valid coins” means the coins indicated on the appropriate parking ticket machine;

“valid parking ticket” means a parking ticket which is purchased at an appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine and which is displayed and has not expired;

“Vehicle” includes a mechanically propelled vehicle whether powered mechanically or electrically or partially mechanically or partially electrically and includes a motor-cycle.

PART II

Pay and Display Ticket Parking

Obligation to
display parking
disc

- 6 (1) The following provisions shall apply during business hours to the parking of a vehicle in a ticket parking place:
- (a) subject to paragraph (2) of this bye-law, a vehicle which is parked in a ticket parking place during business hours shall be parked within the area comprising a parking bay;
 - (b) a vehicle shall not be parked in a buffer area;
 - (c) a vehicle parked in a ticket parking place at a time which is not during business hours shall be removed from the ticket parking place when business hours commence, unless at such commencement and during the remainder of the period of parking, a valid parking ticket is exhibited in the interior of the vehicle in accordance with bye-law 8(3) of these bye-laws or payment is made by electronic means (including an app) and bye-law 8(4) of these bye-laws shall apply from such commencement in respect of such parking;
 - (d) where a vehicle parked in a ticket parking place designated as a loading bay during business hours is a goods vehicle paragraph (1) of bye-law 6 shall not apply until the expiration of thirty (30) minutes after commencement of the parking provided goods are being actively loaded in or on or unloaded from the vehicle during the period which it is parked.
- (2) Notwithstanding Paragraph (1)(b) of this bye-law, a vehicle parked in a parking bay during business hours may project into adjoining buffer area if the length of the vehicle prevents it being parked wholly in accordance with paragraph (1)(b) of this bye-law.

- Vehicles which may be parked in pay and display ticket parking places
- 7 Vehicles only of the following classes may be parked in a ticket parking place during business hours:
- (a) a passenger vehicle with passenger accommodation for not more than twelve (12) persons excluding the driver and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;
 - (b) a goods vehicle whose un-laden weight does not exceed three (3) tonnes and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;
 - (c) a goods vehicle, other than a vehicle described in paragraph (b) of this bye-law, which is parked in an area designated as a loading bay while goods are being actively loaded in or on to it or unloaded from it.
- Obligation to display a valid parking ticket
- 8
- (1) Subject to Article 10(5) a valid parking ticket shall be displayed as specified in this bye-law, on the dashboard in the interior of a vehicle parked in a ticket parking place during business hours;
 - (2) A person may park a vehicle in a parking bay using electronic means when available;
 - (3) a valid parking ticket shall be so exhibited in the interior of a vehicle that a person outside the vehicle can ascertain the time the parking ticket ceases to be valid; and
 - (4) a parking ticket shall be so exhibited in accordance with paragraph (3) of this bye-law for so long as the vehicle is parked in that ticket parking place.
- Zones for parking
- 9
- (1) For the purpose of parking fees to be charged for parking on a public road or car park Ballina Town shall be divided into three (3) zones specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The parking fees shall be:

- (a) For Zone One, seventy cent (70c) per hour and a valid parking ticket or electronic payment (when available) shall be valid for use in all three zones;
- (b) For Zone Two, fifty cent (50c) per hour and a valid parking ticket or electronic payment (when available) shall be valid for use in Zone Three also;
- (c) For Zone Three, forty cent (40c) per hour and a valid parking ticket or electronic payment (when available) shall be valid for use in Zone Three only;

notwithstanding the above hereof the minimum parking fee shall be thirty cent (30c).

- (3) (a) A vehicle parked in a ticket parking place in Zone One during business hours shall not be so parked for a period longer than three (3) hours
 - (b) A vehicle which has been parked in a ticket parking place in Zone One for a period of three (3) hours shall not be parked again in the same ticket parking place until at least one (1) hour has elapsed since the vehicle was last parked in that ticket parking place.
- (4) Notwithstanding provisions of bye-law 9(2)(b) and 9(2)(c) a person may purchase a day ticket for parking in a car park in Zone Two or Zone Three at a cost in the case of Zone Two a fee of three euro (€3) and in the case of Zone Three a fee of two euro (€2).

- 10** (1) A parking ticket shall be purchased from an appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine or payment may be made by electronic means.
- (2) The fee for a parking ticket shall be payable by means of any combination of valid coins accepted by a parking ticket machine or may be made by electronic means.
- (3) Articles 9.(3)(a) and (b) of these bye-laws shall not apply to a vehicle while charging at an e-charging place.
- (4) Payment of cash shall be made by inserting the appropriate fee for the parking time required into the appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine and following the instructions on the pay and display parking ticket machine in order to obtain a valid parking ticket.
- (5) A valid parking ticket shall be displayed immediately on parking provided that, where a vehicle is parked at a time not during business hours, a valid parking ticket shall be displayed in accordance with bye-law 6 from the commencement of business hours.
- (6) A person who pays a parking fee by electronic means (including an app) shall not be obliged to display a valid parking ticket.

Suspension of
pay and display
machines or
ticket parking
places

- 11** (a) The Council or its agents may suspend from operation a pay and display parking ticket machine or a parking ticket place in a parking ticket area. The suspension shall be subject to any conditions which may be specified in writing by the Council.

- (b) The suspension from operation of a pay and display parking ticket machine or a ticket parking place shall be indicated by the placing thereon of a sign or other device indicating that it is non-operational or by the temporary removal of the pay and display parking ticket machine and the erection of a sign indicating that the parking of vehicles is prohibited in the ticket parking place.
- (c) A person who breaches a condition specified in writing by the Council when a pay and display ticket machine or a ticket parking place or area has been suspended shall be guilty of an offence.

Interference

- 12** (a) A person shall not insert any coin, article or object, other than the coins specified for the purchase of a pay and display parking ticket, in a pay and display parking ticket machine, or interfere in any way with a pay and display parking ticket machine.
 - (b) A person (other than an agent of the Council, a member of An Garda Síochána) shall not interfere with in any way with a hood, sign or other device placed on a pay and display parking ticket machine in a ticket parking place.
- 13** (a) A person who displays an invalid parking ticket in a ticket parking area or fails to display a valid parking ticket in a ticket parking area commits an offence.
 - (b) A person who parks in a parking bay:
 - (i) without paying a valid parking fee by electronic means (including an app); or
 - (ii) stays or remains in a parking bay after the time period for which a parking fee has been paid or has expired commits an offence.

- 14 A person shall not park a vehicle in a disabled person's parking bay without displaying therein a disabled person's permit.

PART III

Parking Discs for Residents

Definitions for Part III 15 (1) In this part of these bye-laws:

“acceptable evidence” means the following:

(i) a current insurance certificate confirming that the vehicle is normally kept by the resident at the resident's address in the ticket parking place to which the disc will relate;

(ii)

(a) a vehicle licensing certificate or a registration book confirming that the resident applying for a resident's parking disc is the registered owner of the vehicle in respect of which the application for a resident's parking disc is being made and that the vehicle is registered at the resident's address in the ticket parking place to which the disc will relate; or

(b) where the applicant is not the registered owner of the vehicle of which the application for a resident's parking disc is being made, the vehicle licensing certificate or a registration book for the vehicle satisfactory documentary evidence from the registered owner that the vehicle is normally kept by the applicant at the resident's address in the ticket parking place to which the disc relates and evidence from the Revenue Commissioners that a vehicle owned by the registered owner is normally kept by the applicant; and

- (iii) a driving licence or learner's permit in the name of the resident applying for the resident's parking disc; and
- (iv) utility bills, bank statements or other documentation acceptable to the Council addressed to the applicant at his/her address in the ticket parking place to which the resident's parking disc will relate to; and
- (v) any other information which may be requested by the Council;

"owner" means a resident by whom a vehicle is habitually kept and used;

"resident" means a person, other than the occupant of a purpose built apartment block or premises which has more than six (6) residential units but excluding occupants living in Zone One specified in the Schedule hereto (other than James Connolly Street (Water Lane to Station Road)) or Casement Street who satisfies the Council that his/her normal dwelling place is at premises situated in a street which is a ticket parking place;

"resident's parking disc" means a document issued by the Council or its agents for the purposes of bye-laws 16 to 26 and containing the particulars specified in bye-law 18;

"valid resident's parking disc" means a resident's parking disc issued in respect of the vehicle on which the resident's parking disc is displayed which relates to the ticket parking place or car park in which the vehicle may be parked and for a period which has not expired and which is issued by the Council or its agents.

(2) A resident's parking disc shall not be issued for any street or car park in Zone One other than for Casement Street and Connolly Street between Water Lane and Station Road.

(3) Residents' parking discs may be issued for streets and car parks in Zone Two and Zone Three.

Non-application of bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws

16 Bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in a ticket parking place if there is displayed in accordance with bye-law 18 of these bye-laws, in the vehicle when it is so parked, a valid resident's parking disc.

Particulars of resident's parking disc

17 A resident's parking disc shall contain the following particulars:

- (a) the registration number of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued;
- (b) the expiry date of the resident's parking disc;
- (c) the place in which the resident resides, and shall specify the ticket parking place or car park for which the disc is issued;
- (d) the signature of an officer of the Council.

Permission to park a vehicle displaying a resident's parking disc
Display of resident's parking disc

18 The display, in accordance with bye-law 19 of a valid resident's parking disc on the vehicle in respect of which the disc was issued, shall permit the vehicle to be parked without limitation as to time in a ticket parking place or car park specified on the disc and in the place for which it is issued.

19 A valid resident's parking disc shall be so displayed in the interior of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued that it can be read from the outside of the vehicle.

- Interference with resident's parking disc 20 Where a vehicle displaying a resident's parking disc is parked in a ticket parking place a person shall not interfere with the resident's parking disc.
- Issue of and fee for resident's parking disc 21
- (1) A resident's parking disc may be issued by the Council or its agents in respect of the parking of a vehicle in a ticket parking place specified by the Council.
- (2) A resident's parking disc may be issued by the Council or its agents subject to the provisions of Paragraph (3) of this bye-law 21 in respect of one vehicle of which the resident is the owner where the Council are satisfied, following production of acceptable evidence, that the applicant is resident and to which the disc will relate and that the vehicle is normally kept at or near the resident's normal dwelling place.
- (3)
- (a) Where a premises is a single housing unit the maximum number of residents in that premises who may concurrently hold a resident's parking disc shall be two (2).
- Where a premises consists of not less than two (2) and not more than six (6) residential units the maximum number of residents parking discs which the Council may issue shall not exceed the number of units in the premises subject to a maximum of six (6) residents' parking discs
- (4) No fee shall be payable for a resident's parking disc which shall be valid for one (1) calendar year and shall include fifty (50) complimentary visitors' parking discs.
- Issue of replacement resident's parking disc 22 Where the Council are satisfied that a valid resident's parking disc has been lost, destroyed or stolen the Council or its agents shall issue a replacement to the owner and such replacement disc shall be substituted for the original disc and the original disc shall be void.

Return of resident's parking disc 23 Where during the period to which a resident's parking disc relates the holder ceases to reside at the address notified at the same time of issue of the disc or ceases to be an owner by disposing of the vehicle to which the disc relates, he/she shall return the resident's parking disc and all unused visitors' parking discs to the Council or its agents.

Transfer of parking disc 24 If the holder of a resident's parking disc for a vehicle replaces that vehicle with another the Council or its agents may, following the surrender of the original disc, issue a resident's parking disc in respect of the new vehicle which shall be valid for the remainder of the period specified on the original disc.

Display of a void resident's parking disc 25 It shall be an offence to display an invalid resident's parking disc.

PART IV

Visitors' Parking Discs

- 26 (1) A visitor's parking disc shall not be issued for parking on a street in Zone One (other than James Connolly Street (Water Lane to Station Road) or Casement Street Mayo County Council will specify parking place on disc.
- (2) A visitor's parking disc may not be issued for a car park in Zone One;
- (3) A valid visitor's parking disc shall be so displayed in the interior of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued that it can be read from outside of the vehicle.

Definitions for Part IV 27 In this part of these bye-laws:

“visitor’s parking disc” means a disc or document or a combination of both having marks or symbols capable of indicating the year, date and time when the disc, document or combination of both becomes a valid parking disc and containing *inter alia* the following particulars:

- (a) the words “visitor’s parking disc”; and
- (b) the ticket parking place to which it relates.

“valid visitor’s parking disc” means a visitor’s parking disc which:

- (a) has been issued by the Council or its agents;
- (b) has been perforated or otherwise marked as appropriate to the particular type of parking disc so as to indicate clearly the year, month, day in the month, hour of the day and (to the nearest following five (5) minutes’ period) minute of the hour of the commencement of a period of parking of the vehicle in which the parking disc is exhibited in accordance with these bye-laws;
- (c) indicates no other year, month, day, hour or minute;
- (d) indicates that the vehicle is so parked for a period not exceeding a continuous period of twenty four (24) hours from the time parking commenced;
- (e) has been issued in respect of a ticket parking place or car park in which the vehicle may be parked; and
- (f) is being displayed by a visitor.

Non-application of bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws **28** Bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in a ticket parking place if there is displayed in accordance with bye-law 29 of these bye-laws, in the vehicle when it is so parked, a valid visitor's parking disc.

Display of a visitor's parking disc **29** A visitor's parking disc shall be displayed in the following manner:

- (a) separate distinct perforations or markings as appropriate to the particular type of parking disc so as to indicate clearly the year, month, day in the month, hour of the day and (to the nearest following five (5) minutes period) minute of the hour of the commencement of a period of parking of the vehicle in which the parking disc is exhibited in accordance with these bye-laws;

- (b) the valid visitor's parking disc shall be so exhibited in the interior of the vehicle that a person outside the vehicle can ascertain by reference to the perforations or markings when the parking commenced;

- (c) the valid visitor's parking disc shall be exhibited in accordance with paragraph (b) of this bye-law 29 so long as the vehicle is parked in that disc parking place.

Permission to park vehicle displaying visitor's parking disc **30** The display in accordance with bye-law 29 of a valid visitor's parking disc on a vehicle shall permit the vehicle to be parked for a period not to exceed twenty four (24) hours from commencement of parking in a ticket parking place.

Interference with a visitor's parking disc **31** Where a vehicle displaying a visitor's parking disc is parked within a parking place a person shall not interfere with the visitor's parking disc.

- Issue of and fee for a visitor's parking disc **32**
- (1) Visitors' parking discs may be issued by the council or its agents to a resident in a ticket parking place in respect of the parking of a vehicle which is not normally kept in that place and which requires to be parked temporarily in a ticket parking place for a purpose which is ancillary to the use of the resident's dwelling.
 - (2) The total number of visitors' parking discs which may be issued by the council or its agents to a person shall be fifty (50) in any one twelve (12) months' period;
 - (3) A visitor's parking disc shall be valid for use in a ticket parking place or car park specified by Mayo County Council.

- Offences **33**
- (a)
 - (i) A person who sells a visitor's parking disc to any other person or;
 - (ii) otherwise disposes of a visitor's parking disc to a person other than the visitor to whom it was issued commits an offence.
 - (b) A person who attempts to sell a visitor's parking disc commits an offence.
 - (c) A person who displays an invalid visitor's parking disc commits an offence.

PART V

Long-Stay Users' Parking Discs

- Definitions for Part V **34**
- In this part of these Bye-laws:
- “long-stay user's parking disc” means a disc issued by the Council for the purposes of these bye-laws and contains the particulars specified in this bye-law;

“valid long-stay user’s parking disc” means a long-stay parking disc which relates to a period which has not expired and which is issued by the Council for parking in a car park in Zone One, Zone Two or Zone Three.

“invalid long-stay user’s parking disc” means a long-stay parking disc which relates to a period which has expired and which relates to a long-stay parking disc which is issued by the Council for parking in a car park in Zone One, Zone Two or Zone Three.

- 35** A long-stay user’s parking disc shall contain the following particulars:
- (a) the registration number of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued;
 - (b) the date of issue;
 - (c) the period to which it relates, including the date of expiry;
 - (d) the signature of an officer of the Council;
 - (e) the car park for which the disc is issued.
- 36** The display, in accordance with bye-law 35 of these bye-laws of a valid long-stay user’s parking disc on the vehicle in respect of which the disc was issued shall permit the owner of the vehicle (or any person using it) to park it without limitation as to time in the car park specified herein.
- 37** A valid long-stay user’s parking disc shall be so displayed in the interior of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued so that it can be read from outside of the vehicle.
- 38** Where a vehicle is displaying a long-stay user’s parking disc in a car park, a person shall not interfere with the said disc.

- 39** A long-stay user's parking disc may not be issued for the Market Square car park or the Pearse Street (Military Barracks) car park.
- (b) The fee for a long-stay user's parking disc shall be payable per calendar month or part thereof.
 - (c) The fees for a long stay parking disc are:
 - (a) in a car park in Zone One (other than ones specified in Article 39(a) hereof) shall be forty five euro (€45.00);
 - (b) in a car park in Zone Two shall be thirty five euro (€35.00);
 - (c) in a car park in Zone Three shall be ten euro (€10.00);
 - (d) Long stay parking discs may be issued to rated occupiers liable to commercial rates for car parks in Zone Three at a rate of five euro (€5) per calendar month or part thereof.
- 40** (1) Where, during the period to which a long-stay user's parking disc relates, the user to whom it is issued ceases to be the owner of the vehicle to which the disc relates, he/she shall return it forthwith to the Council.
- (2) Where, during the period to which a long-stay user's parking disc relates, the person to whom it is issued ceases to be the owner of the vehicle to which the disc relates and substitutes another vehicle for same, the Council shall either insert the registration number of the substituted vehicle on the disc or issue to the user a new disc in respect of that vehicle and such new disc shall be valid for the unexpired period.

- 41 Bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in any car park if there is displayed in accordance with bye-law 35 a valid long-stay user's parking disc.
- 42 A person who displays an invalid long-stay user's car parking disc in a vehicle parked in a car park shall be guilty of an offence.

PART VI

Miscellaneous

Non-application
of bye-laws 6 to
13

- 43 Bye-laws 6 to 13 of these bye-laws shall not apply to:
- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic, the removal of a vehicle pursuant to Section 97 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961 (as amended), the immobilisation and release of vehicles, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a public road or car park, the provision, alteration or repair of a main drain, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, oil, water or electricity or of a telephone line or the provision of a traffic sign;
 - (b) a fire brigade vehicle, an ambulance or a vehicle being used by a traffic warden, an authorised person or a member of An Garda Síochána or the Defence Forces in the performance of his/her duties as such a member;
 - (c) a vehicle in which a disabled person's permit is displayed and which is parked for the convenience of the person to whom that permit was granted, if the permit is prominently displayed in the vehicle, when that vehicle is parked in a ticket parking place;
and

- (d) a vehicle powered by electricity while charging at an e-charge place.
- 44 A person shall not in any car park wilfully obstruct or interrupt any employee of the Council in the execution of his or her duty, including the execution of any work in connection with the laying out or maintenance of any part of a street or car park by such employee of the Council.
- 45 A person in a car park shall give on demand to an agent, officer or employee of the Council, authorised for the purposes of these bye-laws by the Council, his or her name and address and a person shall not in any street or car park resist, obstruct or aid or incite any person to resist or obstruct any of the persons referred to in bye-law 43 of these bye-laws in the execution of his or her duty or lawful exercise of his or her authority.
- 46 An employee of the Council shall produce, if requested to do so, evidence of identity and employment by the Council to any person alleged by him/her to be in breach of these bye-laws.
- 47 Nothing in these bye-laws shall operate so as to prohibit the Council from entering into temporary arrangements with individuals and/or groups relating to the use of the streets or car parks set out in Zone One, Zone Two or Zone Three for the purpose of fairs, amusements, festivals and other such events.
- 48 These bye-laws shall not apply to a licensed taxi standing at a taxi stand or to a bus stopped or parked at a bus stop.
