Palm (Passion) Sunday is today and marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most solemn week of the Church's year. For today we thank the Ministers of the Word at all Masses. Our thanks also to those who provided the palms for blessing at the beginning of each Mass. Special thanks to Frank Reid who has been providing the palms in Straide for the past forty years and also to Helen and Diane Burke, Shraheens, for once again donating the palm crosses.

<u>Lent/Easter Confessions:</u> "The Light is on for You" in Bohola and Straide churches this Sunday, April 2nd from **6.00pm to 7.00pm** where a visiting priest will hear individual confessions. You are encouraged to avail of this opportunity to prepare for the Easter celebration in the best possible way. Confessions will also be available with your local priest in the sacristy after each ceremony during the week or at any time by appointment.

<u>The Chrism Mass:</u> This year Bishop Paul is inviting parishioners from every parish in the Diocese to participate in the Chrism Mass at St Nathy's Cathedral, Ballaghaderreen, on this **Monday**, 3rd **April at 7.30 pm**. He would particularly like those who are ministering in parishes such as Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, members of Parish Pastoral Councils, Finance Committees, Sacramental Co-Ordinators, Adoration Groups, Altar Societies, Sacristans, Parish Secretaries, etc., to be present for this occasion. At this Mass, the Bishop blesses the oils that will be used at every baptism, confirmation, ordination and anointing of the sick in the Diocese over the next year. Priests also renew their commitment to service. Following the Mass, refreshments will be available in St Nathy's College. This is an occasion where we celebrate the unity of the people and priests of the diocese with the Bishop. You are most welcome to come and join in the celebration!

Holy Places Collection will be taken up on Good Friday to support our Christian sisters and brothers in the Holy Land. They are the guardians of the Holy Places where Jesus walked amongst us, bringing the Good News that has so powerfully supported us, his followers all over the world, down through the ages. <u>Holy Week Ceremonies</u>: Following consultation with the Pastoral Councils in Straide and Bohola, the arrangements for Holy Week ceremonies were agreed as outlined on the opposite page. There is a bit of give and take on both sides and that is much appreciated. It is a sign of changing times and more change is inevitable as we go forward so there is no guarantee that the same level of services will apply next year. However, there is no point worrying about that now, let us take each year as it comes.

These are the most important church ceremonies of the year, especially the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night — without Easter there would be no Christmas or no Christian faith. You are encouraged to make every effort to attend and celebrate what is at the core of our faith.

<u>Ministers of Holy Communion</u> in Bohola and Straide are asked to renew their commitment for the coming year at the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday at 7.00pm in Straide. We are most grateful for their valuable service in this ministry throughout the year.

Altar of Repose: Even though there is no evening Mass of the Lord's Supper in Bohola on Holy Thursday, there will be an altar of repose set up in the Blessed Sacrament chapel from 6.00pm to 10.00pm where parishioners can respond to the invitation of the Lord to 'keep awake with him and watch for one hour'. It is here also that the Blessed Sacrament is reserved for the distribution of Holy Communion at the Passion on Good Friday.

<u>Calling Straide Decorators!</u> Following the Stations on Good Friday, the church in Straide will be prepared for the Easter Vigil and the Easter season. Anyone who is free on Friday evening to give a hand will be most welcome.

<u>Trócaire Boxes:</u> The face on the Trócaire box is 8-year-old Nasteha Mahat from the Gedo region of Somalia in East Africa. The Mahat family had to leave their farm and village when the last of their goats died from drought and they had absolutely nothing left. Some months before, Nasteha's two-year-old sister, Ardo, had died of dehydration.

We remember the thousands of people who have been killed or injured recently in the earthquakes in Syria and Turkey. Buildings have been destroyed and the infrastructure devastated. Trócaire is working with our partner Caritas Syria to support those affected by this terrible event.

We remember people in Ukraine and other countries affected by conflict including South Sudan, Somalia and the Democratic Republic of Congo, and pray for the millions of people around the world who are in crisis and at risk of being forgotten and left behind.
