'He's always on about Money'

They say that if you get the name of always getting up late in the morning then there is no point in getting up early... because no one will believe you. In the same vein I am always a bit wary of speaking or writing about financial matters — getting the name of being 'always on about money' is something I'd like to avoid. It is important however at least once a year to give an accurate account of parish finances.

The parish holds two main accounts; The Church Account, which is supported by the weekly basket collection, is used for the day to day running and maintenance of the parish. The Priests Revenue Account, which is supported by the four Priest's Collections (the blue topped envelope), is used to pay the priest's monthly stipend, with any excess going back to the diocese to support retired priests and parishes unable to support their clergy.

Each year the Parish Accounts having been completed by our Accountant are audited by the Diocesan Accountants to be submitted to the Charities Regulator.

Last year 2021 was the first full year of accounts since the onslaught of the Covid Pandemic. The reality that the churches had been closed for a lot of that time - only opening very gradually, together with the fact that our Parish Debt was covered in March '21 and the second envelope discontinued, meant that it was hard to estimate how we would be financially at the end of the year. I am happy to say that despite all the uncertainty and thanks to your continued generous support of the parish our finances have remained healthy.

Year on year the envelope income for the Church Account, at €90,000, is down some 15% on pre-Covid figures, which with all things being equal is not bad at all. In 2021 we received €23k from Revenue through the Chy3 scheme and over €12k in donations and bequests. Interestingly enough, money collected via the candelabra was up 25% over the year – possibly due to the fact that people were unable to attend Mass in person.

The Parish's main financial outlay last year was on repairs and maintenance at around €32k, some of which was offset by an insurance claim for storm damage suffered at the Parish Church. Last year both the Oratory and Tiernaur Church were fully painted with some top up painting done in Newport and Mulranny Churches. Last year too the flat roof on the Mulranny side of the Parish church was completely resurfaced with rotten joists replaced. Other major expenses included Diocesan levy €12.5K, Light and Heat €14k, Insurance €15.5k and staff wages €21k. Overall however, because we no longer have the burden of the parish debt to cover, which over the years was a huge drain on our resources, we finished the year with a surplus.

Our Priest's Revenue Account also held its own in 2021. At a time when other parishes struggled to cover their priest's stipend, I am proud to say that the Priests Revenue Account held up very well, even enjoying a slight increase on the previous year. Thank you.

At a time when many homes are feeling the pinch thank you for your financial support for your parish. But, more importantly, thank you for your inspiration and for your faith.

Income and Expenditure Accounts are available for closer examination on the Church notice boards so please take some time to look at them and if you have any questions don't hesitate to ask... 'He's always on about money!"
