DIAMOND JUBILEE OF ORDINATION:

FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

Tuesday: The Irish Martyrs. These were seventeen Irish men and women, cleric and lay, put to death for the Catholic faith between 1579 and 1654 who were beatified in 1992.

Wednesday: St. Aloysius Gonzaga, religious. He was born in Lombardy in 1568 and joined the Jesuit order despite strong opposition from his father. He worked in a fever hospital as a novice but soon caught the fever and died at 23 years of age.

Thursday: Sts. John Fisher, bishop and Thomas Moore, martyrs. John Fisher (1469-1535) was Vice-chancellor and became bishop of Rochester. Thomas Moore (1478-1535) was the first commoner to become Lord Chancellor of England. Both were martyred by Henry VIII.

Saturday: Nativity of St. John The Baptist: The 'birthday' of most saints is the day of their death but we celebrate the death and the birth of John the Baptist on separate days. His birth is the dawning of the New Age. His mission was to prepare the way of the Lord
