#### **Thinking Outside The Bubble**

There is no doubt about it but our shared experience during this Pandemic has brought us closer together as a community and as a country. We have learnt that we have a responsibility of care for each other, that our actions not only affect ourselves but have consequences for those we love, that in terms of health and safety the most vulnerable in our communities depend not just on our actions but on our attention and our support. We are learning of the mental and emotional toll which lack of social and physical contact has on each of us. No one has been left unaffected. Over time words such as 'social bubbles' and 'family pods' serve to underline our interconnectedness.

We know how dependent we are on each other and yet there is a danger that in our concern and care for those we know and love that we can become inward looking and insular in our view of the world. We view 'the outsider' with suspicion, we are more prone to apportion blame to those who have been infected, we begin to look around and judge the actions of others. Self-interest questions the Common Good. On a broader scale there is a growing negativity towards decision makers, various interest groups jostle with each other to be heard, vaccine envy takes root as we wonder why them and not us and an increasing 'nationalism' sees countries competing with each other in an attempt to out purchase and out vaccine their populations. If it goes unchecked Coronavirus could very quickly become a them or us scenario. Yet we know that no one is safe from the virus unless everyone is..

It is as if our focus on 'social bubbles' and 'family pods' has caused us to look in on ourselves and away from the needs of others. Consumed by the virus we have forgotten that war, famine, abuse, racism, etc are the real daily experience of so many of those with whom we share this planet.

Lent is a time when we focus on ourselves in order that we can evaluate how we are engaging with others and with God. We give up something, cut back on something, not just so that we might benefit from the loss of a few pounds or the gain of a few euros, but rather so that in appreciating and being thankful for what we have we might give from our excess to alleviate the suffering of others. In as much as Lent is about me, it is about me and my responsibility to the world.

Each year during Lent Trocaire invites us to look beyond our own needs and towards the needs of others. To help us think outside our bubble, this year's focus is not on poverty in general but rather on how war, injustice and climate change has and continues to effect two particular women as they struggle to rear their children.

Awut and Ajak live in war torn South Sudan. Having both lost their husbands through war they fled the violence and are trying to build a new life for themselves and their children. Covid 19, although a reality in South Sudan is not a concern for them. They need food to feed their children and education to lift them out of their distress.

When we give to Trocaire we are giving to Awut and Ajak and the millions of people like them who live each day in fear of their lives and in abject poverty. We give money but that money gifts hope.
