Celebrating Grandparents

Somehow having been relieved of the responsibility of having to parent their grandchildren, grandparents have the opportunity to enjoy their grandchildren in ways in which they couldn't possibly enjoy their own children. The truth be told grandparents are in the happy position of being allowed to spoil their grandchildren and they are more than happy to do so.

Although I never met either of my grandfathers, I was lucky enough to have known both of my grandmothers. My maternal granny lived in Dublin so we only saw her when she'd come down on holidays or when we'd visit her in Dublin once or twice a year. Granny Nolan however lived across the street from us. Although she died when I was in my early teens I remember her as a small, quiet, yet strong willed woman.

As children Granny Nolan was our point of refuge when we got into bother at home; her hug could sooth all ills, her press always had a plentiful supply of jelly sweets and her purse had an unending amount of three penny coins which she doled out on a regular basis. But my abiding memory of Granny Nolan was her strong and unwavering faith. Her faith was at the centre of her life. Daily Mass and the rosary were as much part of her day as were breakfast, dinner and tea. For her, faith and religion weren't an extra in her life they were an essential part of who she was, and although she seldom spoke about faith it was obvious, even for a young child, that faith was something she treasured dearly.

Next Monday, July 26th is the feast of St Joachim and St Anne, the parents of Our Lady and the grandparents of Jesus. Over the years the feast day has been an opportunity for us as Church to celebrate the role grandparents play in the gifting of faith to children. This year however Pope Francis has nominated Sunday 25th as the inaugural World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

In our modern world where parents find themselves so busy in the 'work' of parenting the role of passing on the faith to the next generation falls more and more to Grandparents. The quiet faith-filled presence of grandparents is a huge gift to children. Small, seemingly insignificant, religious practices nourish and confirm their faith; pausing for the Angelus, the use of a Holy Water font in the home, the lighting of a candle in the local church, the visit to the graveyard, weekend Mass – the bits and pieces of daily life quietly claiming a place for God in our lives while at the same time gifting faith to our children.

In his Letter to Grandparents to mark the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly Pope Francis pays tribute to Grandparents for the enormous sacrifices which they have had to endure during this time of Pandemic but he goes on to highlight the role which grandparents and the elderly will play as our world emerges from the shadow of the Coronavirus. It is he says, Grandparents who are the custodians of faith and of hope for the future.

This weekend as we as parish celebrate the gift which grandparents are to our families and to our community I remember with particular fondness both my grannies. Their quiet and unassuming faith continues to be a source of inspiration and strength to me even after all these years.
