Pastoral Letter

This weekend our Archbishop, Francis Duffy, has written a Pastoral Letter to the people of the diocese. He has asked that the letter be read at all Masses but because we have our First Holy Communion, *Grow in Love* Masses this weekend I have taken its main points and include them here in the newsletter. Next weekend we will look at the letter in more detail.

Archbishop Francis begins his letter by thanking the people and priests of the diocese for their warm welcome. He then goes on to address his hope for the future of our Archdiocese.

'On several occasions I have expressed my own hopes for the future of the parishes in this diocese given the long legacy of faith and now the ongoing drop in the number of clergy. This is not about something that will happen somewhere else and away in the future. This is happening in your parish right now.

At present we have 41 diocesan priests under the retirement age of 75 working in our 56 parishes. There are 4 diocesan priests, well over 75, who continue by choice, to minister with wisdom and great affection for their parishioners. Fortunately we have 7 priests from abroad and 3 Irish priests, who worked with missionary congregations, who now are enriching our experience of church and faith at local level. We currently have two students who are studying for the priesthood. The trend is downward. Retirements and ill health, in addition to so few replacements, mean that our pastoral services have to be reimagined. In six years' time an additional 7 diocesan clergy will be over 75.

Now is the time to plan for greater parishioner led communities of faith

Every parish will be impacted by the current trend, and so I am asking each Parish Pastoral Council, along with neighbouring Parish Pastoral Councils in the Deanery, to address this issue and plan for the immediate future. The question is 'how can we provide for the pastoral needs in our parish and surrounding parishes, given the declining number of priests and with an immediate reduction of one priest in the deanery?'

Priests may celebrate up to three Sunday Masses, including the Vigil Mass. It will be necessary to reduce the current number of Masses so that priests may be able to attend to the pastoral needs of two or more parishes. As is already clear in some parishes in this diocese, it is not necessary to have a priest resident in the parish to have a flourishing community of faith. Certainly a priest or a small team of priests will be available for pastoral needs. It is not necessary to have a Sunday Mass in each church: already several churches have weekday Masses and no Sunday Mass. In some parishes, when the priest is unavoidably absent during the week, parishioners hold a prayer service in their church; this may need to be extended to weekends where necessary.

The Archbishop continued by assuring us that as more and more lay people take on leadership roles in our church that 'training for parishioners to lead prayer services as well as training for Parish Pastoral Councils, Liturgy Councils and Finance Committees will become a feature of diocesan life' and he ends on a note of hope,

'Despite the changes we are witnessing, and the challenges we face, I am convinced that there are good times ahead. This is a very exciting moment for the Archdiocese of Tuam and for the whole Church. I firmly believe that the rich faith and traditions of this diocese will sustain and assist us as we endeavour to continue to witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ'.
