'The Covid' - What's Left?

I remember the evening well. I was out for a walk when at around 6pm I got a text to tell me that the Taoiseach was about to make a live address on TV about 'the Covid'. Being too far from home I popped into a house along the way and in an atmosphere of foreboding and dread we sat waiting for the Taoiseach to come down the steps of Government Buildings to address the nation.

For the previous few months we had been hearing about this new fast-spreading virus, but as is our way we assumed that the problem would remain elsewhere. It didn't, and now in an instant it seemed as if our lives were about to change for ever. As the country held its breath, we watched the Taoiseach outlining the restrictions which would be introduced in what would become the first of a series of 'Lockdowns'.

Even though it is only three short years ago it is hard to imagine a world in which schools were closed, visitors to our country faced compulsory quarantine and travel was restricted to a distance of 5km from home. Those days of Lockdown feel like a distant memory now; the days of cocooning and social distancing a thing of the past. It seems like a lifetime ago since families were unable to visit elderly loved ones, since priests celebrated Mass in empty churches and since toilet rolls became a much-prized commodity.

Those were uncertain days – even frightening days and thank God for the most part those days are well behind us.

But those days brought a goodness and a kindness out of us which are in danger of being left behind as well. Communities came together to help and support the most vulnerable in their midst. A sense of togetherness and responsibility for each other, for our community and for our world emerged as together we faced the unknown and invisible threat. At local level our community sprang into action. While neighbours kept an eye on the elderly and the vulnerable a network of support groups were set up to do shopping, offer lifts and provide contact. Frontline workers like doctors, pharmacists, home

helps and carers ensured essential services were available while local shops stayed open to provide basic necessities. Teams of volunteers offered to sanitise our churches so that they could remain open even with reduced capacity and the introduction of webcam meant that cocooners could participate at Mass.

While keeping away from each other we kept an eye on each other, while being disconnected we realised how connected we actually are, while not allowed to hug or even to touch we grew to appreciate deeply the value of ordinary everyday physical contact. Not being able to travel meant that we began to see again, as if for the first time, the beauty of where we live.

Although Covid is still with us we have moved on. Those first days of fear and anxiety are gone - life has become busy again. We have regained what we had lost, but might we be losing what we gained.
