





SHROUD OF TURIN A FAKE?

"A FILM-MAKER has issued a million-dollar challenge to the British Museum to prove that the Turin Shroud is a fake. David Rolfe, whose 1978 documentary The Silent Witness investigated the mystery surrounding the relic, said that he remains unconvinced by the 1988 tests which seemed to show that the shroud was a medieval forgery. He has challenged the museum which ran the tests, to create a replica, promising a \$1 million donation if it can.



The shroud is a strip of linen cloth bearing the shadowy imprint of the body of a crucified man. It has reposed at Turin cathedral since the sixteenth century, traditionally revered as the burial cloth mentioned in all four Gospel versions of the Crucifixion: "They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews." (John 19:40)

Mr. Rolfe, whose research into the shroud led to his conversion to Christianity, has released a new film, Who Can He Be? which argues its authenticity remains an open question. "If this is a forgery it is the most ingenious forgery in history," he said. It is still unknown how the image on the shroud was made.






