Whose Your Favorite?

This week the 75 boys and girls from our three National Schools, who will make their Confirmation in May, will gather in Tiernaur for a Ceremony of Light. The central moment of that ceremony comes when the parent passes the lighted Baptismal Candle to their child.

The children are looking forward to their Confirmation. It is a big day for them and for their families. Among other things they are excited to meet our new Archbishop, Archbishop Duffy, on his first official visit to the parish. Most, if not all, will not have seen or met an Archbishop before.

I for my part, have reminded them that he is my boss and have told them that if they get a chance that they are to tell him that I am their favourite priest! They are very eager to do so.

I also regularly assure the First Holy Communion children that I am their favourite priest too. They agree that I am, but one bright spark has lately pointed out that I am their only priest, and that fact was underlined for me at their First Confession.

When visiting the class in advance of the night I mentioned that I had invited another priest along to help hear the Confessions. That caused quite a stir. They were fascinated by the 'other' priest. Most of them had never seen, nor met, another priest before, never mind an Archbishop!

That is the reality which is facing us as Church. That is the reality which is facing us as a diocese: there are less priests. How are we to sustain and celebrate faith with fewer ordained priests?

In response to the Archbishop's recent invitation, representatives from seven parishes of our deanery (Louisburgh, Westport, Aughagower, Islandeady, Kilmeena, Burrishoole and Achill) met recently to begin exploring how we might plan for a time when there will not be a resident priest in every parishthere has been no resident priest in Clare Island for over 20 years now. At the moment there are 8 priests, one of whom is 85, serving those 8 parishes. How might our deanery be served by 6 or perhaps 5 priests?

Our gathering was made up of 6 priests and 14 lay representatives. We agreed that faith cannot, and will not, flourish unless all the baptised take responsibility for, and ownership of, their faith. We acknowledged that while it will be a big change for the parish involved, it is not necessary to have a priest resident in a parish in order to have a thriving faith community and that every church does not have to have a weekend Mass. Lay people must be invited, and training must be offered which will empower them to minister to each other and to the wider community. At a time when priests are no longer able to cover for each other at weekends communities should, on the occasion of the unexpected absence of the priest, be in a position to gather and celebrate without him.

It was with this last point in mind that last week, at our night of reflection for Ministers of the Eucharist and Ministers of the Word, we looked at how such a liturgy might happen. It is hoped that, if for any reason, the priest is unavoidably absent a team of people will be in place in each church who will lead a 'Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion'. A number of people volunteered to be trained as 'Leaders' for that liturgy but more are needed.
