





THANK GOD FOR SPORT! I thought this article by Fr. Tod would suit any parish in Co. Mayo last weekend: My uncle, who wasn't the most athletic of types himself, would often ask; 'Where would we be without sport?' He was a lover of sport. You name it, he followed it; GAA, Rugby, Boxing, Athletics, Tennis, Cycling etc, etc... and no conversation with him would be concluded without some reference to whatever was current on the sporting front at that time. He was sport mad but even the least sporty of us can't help but be occasionally swept along by the excitement and exhilaration which sport engenders.

As a country Sport has given us so many memorable moments; Jack Charlton's Euro odyssey in '98, the Rugby team's victory in Croke Park over our near neighbours in 2007, Stephen Roche's Tour de France win in 1987, Padraig Harrington's and Shane Lowry's triumphs in golf's British Open, Sonia O'Sullivan's Olympic silver in 2000 not to mention the more recent boxing golds of Michael Carruth, Katie Taylor and Kelly Harrington. Even though we might know nothing about their respective sports we are rightfully proud of our rowers, our sailors, our hockey and cricket players. Sport has given us many memorable moments as a nation but Mayo's victory in last Saturdays men's All Ireland Semi final gave us one such moment as a county. We had dreamed about such moments for decades, we had suffered heartbreak after heartbreak and yet we kept coming back. Saturday's victory – although not quite the Holy Grail we seek, went along way to healing the hurt of generations of Mayo fans. The win was hugely deserved and this team rightfully acclaimed, but the victory was a vindication of sorts for the Mayo teams which had gone before, given their all and suffered the pain of defeat. It was their victory as much as it was the current team's victory.

In acclaiming this victory we shouldn't forget that each of those footballers began their footballing life far away from the dizzy heights of Croke Park. They began as young children being ferried to training by their parents on wet and dreary Monday nights, they began as the U5s or U6s who were coached by anonymous and often unappreciated coaches, they began as enthusiastic and often not very talented youngsters who were prepared to spent hours and hours honing skills which now seem almost second nature.

Our community is blessed to have so many volunteers who give freely of their time and energy in order that our children can experience sport of every kind. In applauding our great Mayo team we acclaim and thank the many nameless volunteers who gift our children not only with a love of sport but also with the discipline and values which sports develop in the young.

Last Saturday night's match gave us as a county, and dare I say us as a country (with the exception of Dublin!) a much needed lift to our spirits. It has put a pep in our step and a smile on our faces. It has filled our hearts with hope and kept the dream alive.

As a small but faithful congregation gathered for last Saturday's evening Masses, we were very much aware that the county was holding its breath. We tried our best not to get too distracted and prayed for Mayo. We did our bit for the cause.

After his death I learned much more about him, and even more about myself. All he ever asked me was some of my time. And now he has all my attention every single day. *Author unknown*





LEAP OF FAITH: Children are often adept at looking beyond the practicalities and seeing the possibilities. Where a parent or guardian might only see a messy room in need of tidying, a child sees an obstacle course, a castle, a jungle, a magical fairy forest. It can be refreshing to take a breath and remember that there is more to life than our physical, tangible world with its daily routines and to-do lists.

Sometimes circumstances can leave us blinded to life's beauty or meaning. In today's Gospel, some of Jesus' followers are finding it difficult to see beyond the physical. He has been teaching them that he is the living bread, but it is hard for them to accept. They dismiss it as 'intolerable language' and they wonder 'How could anyone accept it?' His teachings are too difficult to comprehend and they are annoyed and offended. Some of them even walk away. But Jesus is offering something more than the practicalities, more than physical food or drink: he offers the bread of life, living bread, his very self. It is a difficult message, but Simon Peter gets to the heart of it: 'You have the message of eternal life, and we believe.'



He is able to see beyond the obvious, to hear the truth at the heart of Jesus' words. Jesus demands a lot of his followers, who must each decide whether or not they want to follow. Are we ready to make that leap of faith?







