A Few Days Away at Home

Tuam diocesan annual Inservice for Priests took place over three days last week. It was the first such gathering since 2019 and was held in our own Mulranny Park Hotel. It was our first time gathering as a group with our new Archbishop, Francis Duffy and around 40 priests were in attendance. To say that everyone thoroughly enjoyed the few days would be an understatement; the hospitality, the setting, the weather, the hotel all combined to make it one of the most successful Inservice we have experienced.

The theme of this year's Inservice was 'Living our Faith – Gifting a Legacy' and our opening speaker was Sean O Rourke, formally of RTE. Sean spoke of his own faith journey and how despite being at the forefront of the Irish media in its calling of the Catholic Church to account, he still is sustained and inspired by his Catholic faith. He spoke of how the pursuit of truth was essential not just for the victims of abuse but for the church itself and he recalled one particular interview he did on the topic. He asked Archbishop Eamon Martin for how long did he think the Irish Church would have to live in the shadow of the sexual abuse scandals to which Archbishop Martin replied 'hopefully, forever'. Sean O Rourke was deeply impressed by that answer. We are a different church, we can be a better Church because of the various scandals.

On Tuesday two Kerry priests spoke of the experience of ministering to groupings of parishes. Both are part of a team of three priests serving five parishes (meaning two parishes in the grouping have no resident priest). Despite the obvious pressure of moving from one place to another to celebrate Masses, to preside at funerals and weddings etc., no parish is left without the services of a priest and the experience of the parish without a resident priest has for the most part been positive with the realisation that rather than losing a priest, they have gained three. On hearing of the Kerry experience we then spoke of how such a model of ministry might look in our diocese.

On Wednesday we first had a speaker on the Irish Synodal Pathway. The invitation is for lay and ordained to journey together as we discern where the Holy Spirit is leading us. As a diocese we are only beginning that journey. The second speaker was a financial consultant! We can no longer assume that in the future the diocese will be in a position to look after its retired priests as it does now - he spoke to us about how we might prepare financially for our own retirement.

On Thursday a Doctor spoke to us about what we need to do to remain healthy. Exercise and diet came towards the top of the list but interestingly enough, it is scientifically proven that prayer, community and friendship all contribute to longer life spans! Following on from that a woman spoke of the value of prayer and of how our prayer life can be enriched by being spiritually accompanied by a spiritual director.

Our few days together finished with our new Archbishop chatting with us as to how we might reshape and restructure our diocese so that every parish will continue to have the services of a priest. He believes that the future of our church will rely on the gifts and talents of the laity and that they will need the best of training and support into the future. It was a great few days. Mulranny did us proud!
