**SYNOD POINTERS #3:** Over the next few weeks we have been asked to print some short points from Fr Gerard McCarthy, Pastoral Outreach Centre, Aras De Brún, Newtownsmith, Galway on the Church Synod that you may find interesting & helpful.

As we continue to prepare for the Synod of the Irish church we must always be conscious of setting specific, realistic, and achievable targets or goal. We have to be careful that we are not setting unrealistic hopes that cannot possibly be realised.

"It would be better not to hold a Synod at all than promise something that cannot be delivered". (Gerard Maloney CSsR)

Keep in mind that the Synod is about journeying together as People of God — and in this journeying we listen to one another with respect; we listen to the hopes, dreams, worries, anxieties, and complaints, as we try, under the guidance of the Spirit, to envisage the Church of the future.

When the Synod for the Irish church was announced, the theme was "For a synodal Church: communion, participation, and mission," and the journey to the Synod itself is to be a time of "prayer, listening, and discernment, involving a nationwide consultative conversation."

So, on this journey we listen to the voice of God's Spirit, AND to the voices of the People of God — through and from this we try to discover a way forward for the Irish church.

"The bishops have outlined some of the reasons a Synod is necessary, including the secularisation of society, the breakdown of trust in church authorities due to abuse scandals, the need for transparency, the call to connect with young people, and the need to honour the role of women and to listen to their deep concerns. They are conscious too of the reality of the many who have left the Church." (Fr. Gerry O'Hanlon SJ)

When we think of the Synod we must also keep in mind that we are trying, first and foremost, to create a space, a place, where ALL are heard and listened to and are allowed to speak with courage and conviction. Out of what is heard, discerned, and prayed about, a way forward will become clear. God has a plan and that same God leads us into a new future where we can meet the challenges we face with hope.
