Up Close and Personal

Apologies to anyone who tried to watch Sunday Mass on Facebook/Youtube last weekend... I forgot to switch on the computer! Well, that's not quite accurate, the computer was switched on – I could see myself, but I forgot to press the record button, which meant that although I could see myself on the screen – nobody could see me.

That was in complete contrast to a situation some months back when although Mass was broadcast live people couldn't see my head and face because I had the camera set too low. I would have imagined that that might have been an improvement but apparently people like to be able to see the celebrant while attending Mass over the internet.

Perhaps one of the unexpected consequences of using a laptop to broadcast Mass during Covid was that it drew the viewer into the Mass. Unlike a fixed camera which at best produces a long range shot of the altar and the celebrant, the laptop brings the viewer right into the action – even closer than when the viewer is actually present in a church. With the laptop on the altar, not only is the priest's face visible but the altar is also visible, as is the ritual action which occurs during the Mass. No longer merely watching Mass from a distance the viewer takes part in the Mass as if they are sitting at the altar.

One of the hopes of Vatican II, the great revolution which took place in the Church some sixty years ago, was that it would help the praying community to engage with and participate in the Mass in a more meaningful way. English replaced Latin, the altar was brought closer to the congregation and the priest no longer celebrated Mass with his back to the people. But those changes alone haven't had the hoped-for results.

For some Mass is still something that happens 'up there' rather than a prayer we pray together as a community, for others it is my time out, my time for God. Despite the changes inspired by Vatican II, many of us still come to attend Mass rather than participate in Mass, we come to listen to the hymns

rather than sing them, we come to 'hear' Mass rather than celebrate it.

Covid has managed to do something that Vatican II struggled to do – it has brought the Mass closer. The internet has brought us closer. What happens on the altar is 'here' rather than up there, the prayers offered are ours rather than his and although we may be alone we sense that we are part of something bigger than ourselves.

Over the past six weeks we have 'trained in' our new Mass Servers. They love being involved and they enjoy being up close and personal. They are amazed and delighted at the ritual involved – how we bow to the altar, how we walk with reverence, when the bell is rung, what colour vestments are worn, the carrying of the communion patten, the kissing of the altar etc. The newness of their experience brings with it wonder and awe and they become part of the ritual.

When we gather as a community for Mass we, priest and people, are part of the ritual. We pray the Mass together. It is in and through the community that Christ becomes present in the proclaiming of the Word and in the breaking of bread.

Watching the Mass over the internet can never replace being part of the community which celebrates Mass. You are never closer or more personal than when you receive Holy Communion.
