THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER 18th April 2021

Jesus assures his disciples that he is risen from the dead and sends them to preach the gospel in his name. He assures us of this too, and we are sent to be his people in our family, among our friends, in all parts of the world.





There is something very ordinary about how Jesus appears after the resurrection. As the apostles were preparing a meal, Jesus comes into the room. We may wonder how he got in; they were surprised. Earlier the two disciples from Emmaus had said they recognized

him in the breaking of bread. Now he would come and have a meal of grilled fishmaybe Saint Peter's fish, popular in Galilee, Later he would share another meal with them, breakfast on the lakeshore. At meals we share conversation, memories. friendship as well as food. Jesus liked that!

Jesus spent a lot of time in what we call table fellowship, it seems he spent more time having meals with people than in the temple. You can go through the gospel and find him at many meals especially the supper before he died.

These are the ordinary ways people gather and meet. That is how he meets us today. The Eucharist, whether online or present with the community, is a privileged meeting with the Lord where he speaks to us, first with words and also with food. It is an example of how he is with us all the time; in fact, he is the hidden presence at every meal we have. Where we gather at a table for food, the Lord is present.





The following is part of the letter sent by the Holy Father to participants in the Spring 2021 Meeting of the World Bank Group and International Monetary Fund, held online from 5 to 11 April 2021.

I am grateful for the kind invitation to address the participants in the World Bank Group and International Monetary Fund 2021 Spring Meetings by means of this letter, which I have

entrusted to Cardinal Peter Turkson, Prefect of the Holy See's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development. In this past year, as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, our world has been forced to confront a series of grave and interrelated socio economic, ecological, and political crises. It is my hope that your discussions will contribute to a model of "recovery", capable of generating new, more inclusive and sustainable solutions to support the real economy, assisting individuals and communities to achieve their deepest aspirations and the universal common good. The notion of recovery cannot be content to return to an unequal and unsustainable model of economic and social life, where a tiny minority of the world's population owns half of its wealth. For all our deeply-held convictions that all men and women are created equal, many of our brothers and sisters in the human family, especially those at the margins of society, are effectively excluded from the financial world. The pandemic, however, has reminded us once again that no one is saved alone. If we are to come out of this situation as a better, more humane and solidary world, new and creative forms of social, political and economic participation must be devised, sensitive to the voice of the poor and committed to including them in the building of our common future (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 169).

As experts in finance and economics, you know well that trust, born of the interconnectedness between people, is the cornerstone of all relationships, including financial relationships. Those relationships can only be built up through the development of a "culture of encounter" in which every voice can be heard and all can thrive, finding points of contact, building bridges, and envisioning long-term inclusive projects (cf. ibid., 216). ..."
