Let Him Out!

Last weekend we had, our now annual, blessing of the Baby Jesus' of our parish. Although numbers were down slightly on other years – some Baby Jesus' were self-isolating! – it's always lovely to see so many little statues placed before the altar for blessing.

Baby Jesus' come in in all sorts of shapes and sizes; from small pudgy ones to tall lanky ones, from tiny new-borns to pretty sturdy looking six-monthers, from babies with full heads of black hair to whispy-blonds. Some came all on their ownio, while others came already ensconced in a fully kitted out crib – one even came in a business envelope nicely positioned inside the plastic window in order to be able to see out.

The Baby Jesus comes in all shapes and sizes and fits hearts of all shapes and sizes - from the worn out and the cynical to the grieving and the sad, from the young and enthusiastic to the weary and the tired, from the lost and the fallen to the happy and the holy. The temptation is to think that Jesus could never be born into my ordinary life, to convince myself that the mystery of Christmas is for others but not for me. If the Christmas Story teaches us anything it teaches us that Jesus is born in the most ordinary of places and at the least expected of times.

Every year Christmas becomes more and more a commercial and secular holiday. As people of faith, we struggle to keep a focus on the religious significance of Christmas. We try our best to 'keep Christ in Christmas'. But in a way keeping Christ in Christmas is to make Christ predictable and safe. As believers we can become comfortable with the Christmas story, we can, almost despite ourselves, get caught up in the cosy retelling of a heartwarming story. We can, unwittingly, confine Jesus to the stable of Bethlehem.

Celebrating Christmas is not about keeping Jesus in a manger. In celebrating Christmas we celebrate Jesus birth into our world – wherever and however we find ourselves. Christmas is about letting Jesus out of the stable and into our hearts: Don't keep Christ in Christmas. Let him out. Let him out of the box of decorations stored in the attic

Let him out of prayers you only say at Midnight Mass

Let him out of carols as background to your shopping.

Let him out of a sentimental story cleansed of violence and pain

Let him out of the crib, where he remains a helpless, unthreatening infant

...where the only woman present is silent and meek ...where poverty is romanticized with no threat and no smell

...and shepherds are cuddly and everyone is white ...and there is no messiness to obscure the miracle Let him out of December's candle-lit coziness

...where his heat melts the wintry ice of our selfishness

...and his buds unfold amidst the mud of injustice ...and his flowers overtake the borders of manicured gardens

...and his harvest fills barns with fruits we never knew existed

Don't keep Christ in Christmas. Let him out. And then, when Christmas comes 'round again, we won't have to "keep him in it", for how could he not be "in Christmas" when he has been here, the whole time, keeping us? Rev Daniel B Bereton
