Emmanuel – We are not alone.

In the film Whistle Down the Wind a group of children find a dishevelled old tramp in a barn whom they believe to be Jesus. When the children's kitten gets sick they bring him to 'Jesus' for healing and when the kitten dies they have many questions to ask. 'Why did Jesus let the kitten die?', 'Why do people die?' In their search for answers, they run to the local church where they are ushered into the priest who his having his tea. Their opening question is direct and to the point: 'Why does Jesus let people die?' The priest slowly leaves down his knife and fork, settles himself on his chair and responds with an answer which is pious, proper and assured. He uses theological language and ideas, he eloquently quotes scripture, he waves his hands and he speaks very precisely as he formulates his answer. He concludes his learned treatise with a confident 'and that's why Jesus lets people die'. On finishing the priest pours himself another cup of tea and sits back content that he has answered the question correctly. The children nod, thank the priest and head for home. On the way home one little boy turns to his sister and says: "He doesn't know either, sure he doesn't?'

In the face of tragic death there are no easy answers.

These last days have been dark days for our parish as families and communities have struggled to cope with the loss of loved ones. Death is always an unwelcome visitor - but when death visits at Christmas time the grief and the devastation seems all the greater. As news of a death trickles through the parish, particularly if the death is unexpected, it brings with it a realisation not only of the fragility of life, but also of the inadequacy of words both in describing the depth of our pain and in comforting the bereaved. We rush to offer support and quickly find that we have no words. In the end our presence speaks more powerfully than any words. In an effort to comprehend tragic death we search for answers only to find that often the best we can hope for is to learn to live with the questions.

Two weekends ago we celebrated Christmas. At the heart of our Christmas celebration is the birth of a child in a cold and inhospitable stable at the edge of civilisation. God chooses to come into our world; in all its messiness, in all its imperfection, in all its limitations. At Christmas we celebrate that God becomes one of us and in becoming one with us God knows and shares in our pain and our brokenness.

What our celebration of Christmas is telling us is that when we are lost, when we are broken, when we can find no words, God, Emmanuel, is with us. We are not alone!

Maybe that is all that can be said in the face of such sadness and grief as we have experienced in these last dark days.
