## **Broken Glasses**

I am happy to say that I know most of the boys and girls making their Confirmation – we had gotten to know each other when they made their First Communion and many of them subsequently became Mass Servers in the various churches, but one of the many unfortunate side effects of Covid is that I never got the opportunity to get to know the children preparing for their First Communion this year. In a normal year I would be popping in and out of their classroom. I would have met with their parents and we would have had a series of 'Do This in Memory' First Communion preparation Masses. That was not possible this year and with our churches closed for public worship for much of the year we have had very little interaction. A year is a long time in the life of a child.

Since January we have celebrated a Friday morning children's Mass which was child friendly and focused on the children of the parish, particularly those preparing for the Sacraments. When schools were closed, the Children's Mass proved particularly popular with parents homeschooling children, and post lockdown, before churches reopened, schools were able to livestream the Mass into the classroom.

With the opening up of churches however both the First Communion Classes and the Confirmation Classes have been able to join us for weekday Masses in Mulranny and Newport churches. It has been lovely having them attending in person and so important for them to grow familiar with their church and the whole ritual surrounding Mass.

On one of the first mornings that the First Holy Communion children visited the church for Mass I went over to chat with them and to ask them their names. I then told them that I was Fr Tod only to be told that they knew that. When I asked them how they recognised me – I was wearing a mask – they gave two answers: firstly they recognised me from the computer Mass and secondly they said that they 'the' me because I was knew Notwithstanding my internet fame it struck me that for children of First Communion age a priest is a very rare species indeed and for many, if not most, I am the only priest they would have seen or even heard of!

This week we celebrated First Confession. Due to Covid it was a much simpler occasion than we have grown used to. This year's First Confession was held in the schools with no family present. It was nonetheless a very significant moment for the children, one which they entered into with great sincerity and authenticity. Gone are the days of fear and dread, confession for our children is an experience of God's forgiveness and love. It was a truly beautiful and joy filled occasion.

Despite our more sophisticated world children still maintain much of their innocence. Some 'sins' never to out of fashion; pinching my sister, not doing what I am told and even throwing stones still feature among modern day 'sins'. It is sometime hard not to smile but smile I did some years ago when a young boy told me that he had broken his sister's glasses. 'Oh' I said 'did you sit on them?' 'No' came the reply 'She had them on her when I hit her'.

Due to Covid restrictions numbers permitted to attend will be limited to 7 people per family, i.e., the child receiving the sacrament plus 6 others.

In organising both First Communion and Confirmation parishes have been asked to stress to parents that any social gatherings following the church celebration must be 'planned in line with prevailing public health advice on household mixing and indoor and outdoor gatherings.'

During the week, in preparation for First Communion 29 boys and girls made their First Confession. Congratulations! They were a credit to their parents and to their schools. Their parish is immensely proud of each of them

## **Returning to Mass**

In order to gather safely you are reminded to please

- 1. Wear a mask
- 2. Sanitise your hands on entering and on exiting the church.
- 3. Be mindful in church of social distancing requirements

- 5. In Newport Church if seated in the front half please enter and exit via the side doors. If seated in the bottom half please enter and exit via the main door.
