When my parents were alive I spent a lot of my spare time visiting dad while at the same time keeping an eye on mam. It was no burden, in fact it was a privilege, I remember however at the time thinking that that time spent with my parents was precious because when they would inevitably be gone not only would I not have the opportunity but that I would have lots of time on my hands. Not so. I somehow seem to have no more free time now than I did back then

As the school year draws to a close and First Communion and Confirmation are done for another year it would seem that there should be plenty of time to visit other classes in the schools or to organise more gatherings for our Pizza and Coke group but somehow that time never seems to materialise and those things don't happen

At the beginning of every Summer myself and my two golfing buddies promise each other that we will play golf once a week for the summer months. We promise but it never happens - its been almost two years ago now since we last played.

Time has a way of slipping between our fingers and getting lost. There doesn't seem to be enough time for everything.

Some years ago I had a series of conversations with a religious sister of the Poor Clare Order, which is an enclosed order of nuns. I remember at one point commenting that she was lucky to have so much free time for prayer. She looked at me with a perplexed look on her face. What did I mean 'free time for prayer'?. I continued digging my hole... and explained that as I was so busy and hadn't much time to spare that I often found it hard to find time for prayer. She smiled at me and simply said 'Make time. If you are too busy to pray, you are too busy!' She went on to explain that in monastic life prayer is not something to be done during 'free time', on the contrary their schedule is such that time for prayer is set aside each day so that free time is 'free'.

In the end God has made plenty of time. It's just a matter of prioritising the time we have. We can 'make' time for things which are important; family, friendship, community, God.

This summer I hope to make time for prayer and to make the time to meet up with my golfing buddies. What will you make time for?
