# Meetings!

I attend a lot of meetings. This wasn't a bad week with just six... but sometimes that number can be as many as ten per week. Because I chair a number of Diocesan groups I often have meetings about meetings where agendas are agreed, and processes are developed in advance of the full group meeting. Meetings are important – they allow for collective input and responsibility, they give people a voice, they foster inclusivity. But meetings can be time consuming and at times they can be energy draining.

Imagine for a moment that God in choosing how He would come into the world decided to ask us for our advice. How would we go about working out the details?

The first thing we would do I suppose would be to form a committee to oversee the process. Meetings would be held, and a chairperson elected. Subcommittees would be set up, each of which would be given responsibility to report back on the various aspects of the task. True to form there would be a welcoming committee which among other things would draw up a list of those to be invited, an entertainment committee would ensure that there was something for everybody, a publicity committee would be charged with informing as many people as possible via social media etc. A health and safety committee would make sure that every possible eventuality was foreseen and a 'diversity' committee would be charged with ensuring that everybody is included and no one's sensitivities are hurt.

But it is unlikely that, despite the multitude of meetings any of those committees would countenance the possibility of God taking the form of a baby and be born in a smelly stable in an obscure outpost.

Meetings are important but some meetings are more important than others. Next week the priests of the diocese will gather in Knock for an afternoon. They have been invited by Archbishop Duffy to come together in order to consider how the ever-changing landscape of church will affect them

and how they minister. The meeting is not so much about how we will serve the parishes of our diocese with fewer priests, it is not about grouping parishes together, it is not about the training and employing of lay people to become more involved in running the local parish. The meeting is about providing an opportunity for the priests of our diocese to reflect on how such changes will affect them both personally and in their ministry as priests.

As a diocese we are heading into uncharted territory. Many if not most of our priests have come from a different era. Over time we have become accustomed to working on our own, we have become part of, and are inspired by, the identifiable community which we serve, it has been important for us to know 'our' people and for 'our' people to know us. Our parish has been our home. That model of priesthood is no longer practicable nor possible. How we 'priest' is quickly changing and therefore we too need to be open to new ways and models of ministry.

In the coming months there will no doubt be more meetings on this topic. Planning will take place and new structures set up. But in the end it is important and consoling to remember that everything doesn't depend on us and that God's plan may not be our plan.... God Bless, Fr Tod
