The rich man kept his wealth, but he was sad. The gospel reminds us that full and true happiness is found, not in possessions and reputation, but in the way we share our lives in love with God and others.





The gospel of the rich man who could not let go of his wealth focusses us today on wealth, prosperity and possessions in our lives. A few indications from Pope Francis are challenging to us personally and in society:

From Gaudete et Exsultate, 'Wealth ensures nothing. Indeed, once we think we are rich, we can become so self-satisfied that we leave no room for God's word, for the love of our brothers and sisters, or for the enjoyment of the most important things in life'.

From Fratelli Tutti:

Not to share our wealth with the poor is to rob them and take away their livelihood. The riches we possess are not our own, but theirs as well. In the words of Saint Gregory the Great, "When we provide the needy with their basic needs, we are giving them what belongs to them, not to us".

Wealth has increased, but together with inequality, with the result that "new forms of poverty are emerging". The claim that the modern world has reduced poverty is made by measuring poverty with criteria from the past that do not correspond to present-day realities. In other times, for example, lack of access to electric energy was not considered a sign of poverty, nor was it a source of hardship. Poverty must always be understood and gauged in the context of the actual opportunities available in each concrete historical period.





PUBLIC HEALTH GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING

MASS: With the easing of restrictions we are now allowed to have 50% capacity in our church. This means that every second pew can now be occupied. However, we are still obliged to wear some form of face covering while in church and sanitise our hands- even if we have received the vaccine.

From this weekend we will recommence the distribution of communion at the normal time i.e. not at the end of Mass as has been the case during Covid.

Please use the lighters for lighting candles as the hand sanitiser is highly flammable.

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: In these days, the Catholic Church throughout the world and in Ireland is beginning a series of conversations about what God wants of his people at this time. These conversations are often referred to as a Synodal Process. "Synodal" comes from a Greek word which means "walking together".

On Sunday 17th October we mark the opening of this Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission*. This Synodal Process coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

The following is part of the English text of the greeting extended to teachers and educators for World Teachers' Day, by representatives of various religions who participated in the Vatican encounter on the Global Education Pact.

- providing the students with a holistic education - not only communicating information but also nurturing curiosity, a life of the spirit, and a sense of our ethical connections to each other and to all life on our planet.- empowering the family and cooperating with other educational groups, educating them to be welcoming especially towards those who are most vulnerable and marginalised.
