New Habits

When Covid began I had to consciously stop myself from shaking hands. Hand shaking came so natural to me that it seemed that I'd have to tie my hand behind my back in order to stop myself. Yet now, two years later and with the end of Covid in sight, not only have I lost the habit but I find myself almost recoiling if someone offers to shake my hand. Old habits don't die too hard.

Experts tell us that whereas it can take years to form a habit that it takes only a matter of months for habits formed over a lifetime to be lost. We are creatures of routine, and many of those routines have become so much a part of us that we scarcely even notice them.

President Biden is currently in the process of nominating a new Judge to sit on the US Supreme Court. It's an arduous process, at the end of which the chosen candidate will have their lives examined in minute detail.

Four years ago, Judge Brett Kavanaugh was nominated. As part of the confirmation process he was asked to submit a highly-detailed personal calendar from his high school days. Some of his opponents noticed that "going to Mass" was not on his calendar—and that seemed an odd omission for a devout Catholic.

Kavanaugh explained this by saying, "Some have noticed that I didn't have 'church on Sunday' on my calendars. I also didn't list 'brushing my teeth.' And for me, going to church on Sundays was like brushing my teeth: automatic. Still is."

For many of us going to Mass, pre Covid, was very much part of who we were. It was as much part of our routine as brushing our teeth or shaking hands. Perhaps we didn't give it much thought but that didn't mean we didn't value it. We valued the time it offered us to slow down and reflect, we appreciated the opportunity to gather with and for our community in prayer, we treasured the experience of support and the sense of belonging that it brought, we cherished receiving Holy Communion, we may even have welcomed the rhythm and discipline which going to Mass gave to

our lives. Going to Mass was a habit and a routine which, although we scarcely thought about it in such terms, added greatly to the quality our lives. Many people, post Covid have found, sometimes to their own surprise and alarm, that that weekly routine is now broken. A routine, once very much part of their lives now gone. Some wonder how this could happen to a "good" person, but it's important to recognize that when we talk about the formation of a habit or routine, we are talking about human psychology — not about faith or devotion. Irrespective of how deep our faith may or may not be—regardless of our personal level of love for God — the routine has been lost because gradually the software in our brains has been reprogrammed. Since the reopening of our churches, we have gradually been returning to our pre Covid routines. It's not all plain sailing. In both Newport and Tiernaur, Holy Communion is now distributed at 'Communion' time and we have to remind ourselves not to walk out the door after receiving. Likewise, we have a new Archbishop and I have to keep reminding myself- not successfully yet, to pray for Archbishop Francis. It's not easy learning new habits!

For those of us who have lost the habit of regular Mass going, now might be a good time to reestablish a habit for ourselves which was first established by others for us. The first step is the decision. Why not decide to start for Lent?
