What Now?

Monday was the longest day of the year. And a lovely day it was!

I am not quite sure whether I like the longest day of the year or not. It's great to think that we are in the heart of the summer – some infact say that the summer only begins on June 21st, but on the other hand as the year turns we are heading into shorter days and longer nights. I suppose liking June 21st or not is a bit like judging a glass to be half full or half empty – it very much depends on one's attitude and one's perspective.

A pessimistic attitude can prejudice how we see the world. If we only look for the negative, we will only see the negative, if we only search out faults in others then we will only find faults in others. The summer solstice may indeed signal the shortening of the length of days but it also reminds us that we have a whole summer before us, a summer full of opportunities, a summer where we, please God, will return to some sort of 'normality'.

The reopening of society with the gradual return to church signals both a challenge and an opportunity for us as a parish community to begin again. It is an opportunity for all of us to consider the importance of faith and of parish in our lives. How can we enhance the life of our parish community? What gifts, talents, insights have we to offer which might build a stronger and more vibrant community? What responsibility have we to ensure that this community of faith will be here for generations to come?

As parents what, in terms of faith, do we want to gift our children? What experience of parish and of church would we like them to have? How can we ensure that our children will have a positive and lifegiving encounter with Jesus at Mass? How do we pass on the 'practice' of the faith to the next generation?

As teenagers and young adults what kind of parish would we like to be part of? How can we inspire, involve, include and hear the voices of our youth? How can parish be relevant and meaningful to the lives of our young people? Can we offer practical

ways in which faith can find expression in our community and in our world?

In many ways our church has been asleep for almost 18 months. In that time we as a church have changed. As the church awakens, we can look at where we are from two different perspectives. We can bemoan what we have lost and turn our energy to restoring our church and our parish back to where it was. Or we can see this as an opportunity to begin again, to create a better church and a better parish. We can convince ourselves that these past 18 months hasn't changed us or we can seek to learn from the experience and discern where God might be calling us as a community through this time of testing.

I am not too sure whether I like June 21st or not. I am sure that through this experience of Pandemic God is calling us not to be the same as before but rather to be better than before. This is a time of great opportunity for our church and for us as a parish community.
