<u>Der</u>

At a time when every teacher had a nickname – some only marginally kinder than others, we simply called him 'Der'. That was his first name; Dermot, and he taught me maths for my Leaving Cert

My memory of Der back then is of a slightly dishevelled character; a man who moved slowly but purposely through the corridors of St. Jarlaths. Obviously highly intelligent but blessed with a very friendly nature, Der had all the qualities of a bumbling professor, and the fact that he taught honours maths to the Leaving Cert only added to his aura and mystique. As a boy I was in awe of him.

When the time came for me to choose my subjects for my Leaving Cert I wondered about giving honours maths a go but wasn't overly confident in my own ability. After much soul-searching I plucked up the courage to go and ask Der what I should do. I will always remember that short but hugely significant encounter. Without a moment's hesitation Der looked me straight in the eye and told me that of course I should do honours maths — I would be well able for it. Coming from him, those words instilled a confidence and belief in myself and in my ability which in many ways changed my life.

Der was a brilliant teacher, patient and affirming. He could make the most complicated of concepts accessible to our young minds but, more importantly, he had that wonderful ability to bring the very best out of his students by helping them to believe in themselves, (that same ability was evident in his coaching of football and swimming teams). There were no teaching aids in those days-I can still see him leaning back on the teacher's chair while solving problems on the board behind him or getting us to see imaginary parabolas which he'd trace with his hands and plot in reverse so that they could be read from our side.

Some ten years after completing my Leaving Cert I returned to St Jarlath's as a teacher and Der, by that time Principal of the school, welcomed me as

an equal, becoming my mentor and my friend. He was marvellous company, had a sharp wit and could talk engagingly about any and every topic from sport to politics.

In later years we worked together at a diocesan level in development and planning. Although by nature he was a cautious man, Der continued to have great faith in the God-given potential of lay and ordained alike and was convinced that together, and with the grace of God no challenge facing our church was insurmountable.

Just over a year ago Der was diagnosed with cancer. He bore his sickness with great dignity and with typical good humour. Der died last week.

Although I will miss his insight and advice, I hope that I can in some way along the line gift others with some of the self-belief with which Der gifted me. Fr Dermot Maloney 1938-2023 RIP
