Dear brothers and sisters, South Sudan, where I call home and where the two families on your Lenten box this year are struggling to survive, is going through deep pain. The dangers of the spread of Covid-19 are still very high, because of the security risk, Our health facilities are what they are. We are still in the situation of conflict and violence. Our children cannot go to school, and they pay the highest price. Their parents don't know a way out of this situation - but when I go into the streets to eat my meals with the children, someone will always run to buy me tea. They say, "You deserve it Father" and they give me hope. These are my people in South Sudan today. These precious children, women and men. In their poverty, in their fears of the consequence of war, in their traumatised spirits, they are still trying their best to come out of it.

My appeal to you is, please don't leave South Sudan alone.


