*Glorious Martyr, Oliver,  
who willingly gave your life for your faith,  
help us to be strong in faith.  
May we be loyal like you to the message of Jesus.  
By your intercession and example may all hatred  
and bitterness be banished from the hearts  
of Irish men and women.

as it did in your heart,

St. Oliver Plunkett is the Patron Saint of Irishtown Church. The church was officially opened and dedicated in his name on his Feast Day 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1975. The stained glass window at the front of the church depicts his execution at Tyburn, England on the 1st July, 1681. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered for treason and "promoting the Roman faith." Oliver Plunkett was beatified in 1920 and canonised in 1975, thus becoming the first new Irish saint for almost seven hundred years.
