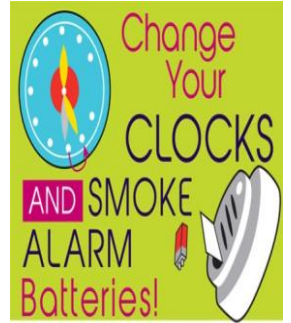

PASCHAL MULLIN, GLENCORRIB – RIP

It is said that the death of a parent is an experience that will stay with you and shape the rest of your life. The Mullin have faced that experience same twice in the past four weeks. God took mum, Mary Delia home to him on 27th September 2022 and dad, Paschal a month later on 27th October 2022. It's been a very difficult time for the family. We pray that the Lord will console them in their grief and help them remember their mum and dad in the good times, in a happy way and thank God for giving them such wonderful parents as we thank God for giving them to us as good friends and neighbours.

Paschal was born in 1939 and was the youngest son of Michael and Mary Mullin. He grew up in Shrule village and attended Shrule NS along with his three older brothers, Fr. Noel, Frank & Joe. He attended St. Mary's college secondary school in Galway city where he met some lifelong friends. During his secondary school days he developed his talent for handball and was an interest he carried with him in his career as a teacher. After studying Commerce at UCG, he then took the H Dip (Higher Diploma) and did his teacher training at Kilroe NS under the master Ger Heneghan. Ger and Paschal became good friends. In the late 1950s when the new Mass liturgy was being introduced, the then Glencorrib curate Fr. Power wanted to encourage new choir members. So as Ger and Paschal were teaching in Kilroe NS they automatically enlisted. They also persuaded Harry Heneghan to join then as they made their weekly trips to choir practice in Glencorrib Church. It was at around this time that Paschal spotted a young Mary Delia Petty as she played the church organ and their friendship and romance grew from strength to strength and they were married in 1965. Paschal took over the family pub business in Shrule and continued to teach at St. Colman's secondary school in Claremorris.

In the mid 1970s Paschal and the family moved to Glencorrib and built a beautiful home there with a magnificent view of the village and the Partry mountains. They easily settled into their new home in Glencorrib. He sold the pub in Shrule but always maintained strong bonds with Shrule. He enjoyed keeping the garden neat and tidy and life was good. He enjoyed a game of golf in Ballinrobe and continued the interest in handball in St. Coleman's where he took extracurricular studies that encouraged less sporty lads to take up handball instead. In St. Coleman's he taught Business Studies, Economics and Accountancy from 1971 to 2005. He managed the tuck shop in the school which raised much needed funds for the school and set up a mini company with St. Coleman's Credit Union which helped the students to manage money and savings. From reading the condolences on rip.ie and talking to some of his friends, he was a very well liked teacher with words like kind, empathy, never raised his voice, caring, talented, modest, a gentleman, supportive, generous with his time, quiet, a very unassuming man, and a lovely man to meet. His close friends also describe him as a man with a soul of discretion and always gave good advice when asked. When he retired from St. Coleman's he was asked to take the chairman's seat on the Board of Management of Glencorrib NS and held this from 2007 to 2019. He was a brilliant chairman and worked extremely well with the other board members, teachers and staff. The school went from strength to strength which was a result of his dedication, commitment and support. His son Noel now continues in his father's role as chairman. Paschal enjoyed singing in the choir in Glencorrib and up to just before Covid, he sung every weekend. He enjoyed meeting the team, practicing and learning new hymns with his daughters Bernadette and Annette who played the organ.

Even though Paschal was a very private man, he along with Mary Delia always enjoyed a good chat and a laugh. He had a lovely smile and she had a lovely laugh. Along with Mary D, they always put their family first. They were an exemplary couple really. Where you saw one you saw the other, like salt and pepper. They did everything together, attended social events and meetings together, they went to Mass together and prayed together. They were so lucky to have three of their children settling down in the village and son John just 5 mins away in Headford while watching their grandchildren grow up. Paschal was a great taxi for collecting the grandchildren from school and Mary Delia enjoyed having them over and cooking for them. It was a great visiting house for family and friends and you never left without a cuppa tea and something to eat. Paschal and Mary Delia will be missed terribly by Annette, Noel, Bernadette, John, their grandchildren, brother Frank and the extended Mullin and Petty families. But they have left a fine great rich legacy behind them in their family and the example they gave us, the friendships and laughs they shared with us. Its memories like this that will remain with us forever. Rest in peace now Paschal your work is done.
