### Passing on the Baton

The last of my aunts died some weeks ago. When I say the last I actually mean the second – I only had two aunts. I come from a small family. I also only had two uncles both of whom are dead. And so with the death of my parents in recent years, all of that generation of my family are now gone to their eternal reward.

Before my aunt died I hadn't really thought about it in those terms. Somehow, I had almost naively assumed that someone from that generation would always be with us. It wasn't that I was particularly close to my aunt, but her being there meant that there was always an older generation to call on, that there was, if needed, a font of family history and wisdom to drink from and indeed that even when we didn't know it or need it that there was always somebody looking out for us. It is a sobering and even a frightening realisation to think that my generation are now the 'elder lemons' of our clan and as someone said to me recently that it is now our turn to step into the 'waiting room'. '

The loss of the previous generation has hit me harder than I would have expected. Even though I didn't realise it at the time it was comforting and reassuring to know that they were there for me, and somehow, because they were there, it took a burden of responsibility from me. I was still someone's nephew or niece, still someone's child.

The passing of the previous generation places added responsibility on the our shoulders. It is now up to us to be there as a support and a buttress for the next generation, we are now the holders of the family treasury of story and wisdom, it is us who now keep a quiet eye out for the nieces and nephews. The standard has been set. We now must step up to the mark.

November is the month of the dead. It is that time of year when we remember especially those members of our families and friends who have gone before us. Of course we are reminded of them every day; we hear them in a word or expression they would have used, we identify them in an idiosyncrasy we find in ourselves or in another, we

see them in the smile of a grandchild, we encounter them in an unexpected smell, we meet them in a memory which comes from nowhere, we think of them in moments of quiet. They have left us, but they are never far away.

They leave us with more than memories. Their passing passes on the baton to us. It is now our turn to take up the story, to carry on the tradition, to be that comforting and reassuring presence for those who follow.
