The Light of the Parish

Standing proudly overlooking the town of Newport our Parish Church, St Patrick's, has been a feature of the Newport Skyline for over 100 years. Its commanding structure is both a testament to the faith of our ancestors and a symbol of the central place that faith continues to play in our lives. A building of unique splendour, St Patrick's is a National Monument and a structure of great architectural significance. Together with the stunning Viaduct, it is an iconic sight and beacon of welcome for all who approach the town. Our Parish Church is an integral part of the beauty of the area, and at night-time can be seen for miles around.

The current exterior lighting of the Parish Church is excessively bright, indiscriminate, and poorly focused; the resulting white glare while being detrimental to the environment makes driving around the church at night very dangerous. The current system is also extremely energy inefficient and prohibitively expensive.

For some years now work has been ongoing on a plan to light the church and viaduct in a more sustainable and nuanced way. In 2021 a working group consisting of representatives of Mayo County Council, Friends of Mayo Dark Skies, Parish Newport Burrishoole and Association among others, and funded by the Heritage Council launched Newport Master Lighting Plan which envisions a pathway to the provision of a more sustainable and less intrusive lighting of the town. Beginning with the Church and the Viaduct the new lighting plan for the town aims to enhance and accentuate its beauty while at the same time being more sustainable and environmentally sensitive.

With funding from the Heritage Council, the Dept of Rural and Community Development and Mayo Council the new lighting scheme has been designed by award winning lighting designer Kerem Asforuglu. Bringing this unique project to realisation will make Newport an exemplar in lighting design for the rest of Ireland.

Implementation of the Master Plan will begin in late October and will focus on St Patricks. While elegantly enhancing the night lighting of the church it will reduce energy levels by almost two thirds, diminish our carbon footprint and significantly lower ever-increasing costs. Work will be done in three phases.

Phase One will involve the removal of the current flood lighting and the installation of heritage lanterns at ground level. The light emitted from these are non-glare and a softer tone. The removal of the spotlights will mean that for the duration of Phase One (3months or so) the Church Tower will remain unlit.

Phase Two will introduce down lighting placed on the building itself. The introduction of architectural lighting will focus on the tower and windows, highlighting their appearance with subtle lighting. It is planned to include a special timed feature to showcase the Harry Clarke window at night by discreetly projecting its image on the horizontal plane. It is envisaged that Phase Two will be completed by February 2023.

Phase three will then begin working on the lighting of the Viaduct.

In a time of ever-increasing awareness of our collective responsibility to conserve energy while at the same time protecting the environment, the relighting of our Church is a timely opportunity for us as a parish community, not just to play our part, but to lead the way in lighting conservation.

If you have a chance, please take some time to drop into the Church porch and take a look at how the proposed changes will enhance the lighting around the church.
