Confessions?

As a priest I hear less and less confessions and those I do hear are usually of the 'shopping list' variety, a habit we sadly learn from an early age. I remember once hearing a young boy's first confession. When he had named out his two or three sins I casually asked him 'was that all?' With a scrunched up nose and worried little face he thought for a few seconds and then with a big broad smile he answered; 'Yes Father, but I will have more the next time!'

For most of us it has become the forgotten sacrament. Give us baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, Marriage even Anointing of the Sick – and hopefully in that order, but the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Confession? Hasn't sin gone out of fashion, and anyway if we do need forgiveness can't we go directly to God ourselves? Why bother the priest – isn't he's killed out already!

There are many reasons why our sense of sin seems to have almost disappeared. In many ways it is a response to the past when there was undoubtedly an over emphasis on sin and not enough emphasis on God's boundless mercy. Sin and guilt almost became the hallmark of Irish Catholicism.

But have we lost our sense of sin because we have lost our sense of God? Perhaps we have never moved on from the image of God as the great book keeper in the sky, who ignoring the heroism of our ordinary lives, just sits there adding to his list of misdemeanours and waiting to pounce.

Do you remember in the story of the Prodigal Son what happens when the wayward son turns for home? As soon as his father sees him, he immediately drops everything, runs to him, and 'clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly'. So overjoyed was the father at his son's return and so anxious to forgive, that he doesn't even give his son an opportunity to begin his well-rehearsed speech of sorrow. There is no mention here of that great big ledger, no reconciling of lists, no accusation or recrimination — only total and unconditional mercy and forgiveness.

You will have noticed during these cold, clear and frosty days how dirty the car windscreen seems to

have become. In the dark and rain we seldom see the smudges, grime and imperfections on the glass. It is only in the bright light of the morning or evening sun that they appear.

It is in looking at the light that we become aware of our darkness. In looking towards God, in turning our attention to God we inevitably become aware of the dark areas and smudges in our own lives. But what does God see? God only sees God's beautiful child, God's wonderful creation turning for home - and that same God comes to meet us, not with an opened ledger, but rather with opened and welcoming arms wanting only to clasp us in those arms and to kiss us tenderly.

You see, Confession, The Sacrament of Reconciliation isn't for God's sake — it's for our sake! God already knows our sins. But for us to come to know God's mercy we must experience it, we must turn towards the Light of God's presence. Our Christmas Penitential Service will take place this <u>Tuesday at 7pm in Mulranny and at 8pm in Newport.</u> A number of priests will be available and you would be more than welcome.
