The Idea of the Holy

In the early 1920's Rudolf Otto wrote a book called 'The Idea of the Holy' in which he argued that the foundation of all religious belief comes from an experience of what he calls the 'Holy'. This awareness or sense of the 'wholly other' is not, he explains, based on reason or sensory perception and cannot be defined in terms of rational concept or experience. In short what Otto was saying was that our sense of the 'Holy' is not something which can be taught or gifted to another, rather it is awakened within us when we come into the presence of the sacred.

By no means an easy read, Ottos book became a foundational text in the Philosophy of Religion. Its central tenet however; that religious experience is a sense of the mysterious which understanding has stayed with me over the years. Last Sunday evening we assembled at Burrishoole Abbey for our Corpus Christi Procession. We were blessed with a lovely mild summer's evening and a large gathering of parishioners were present. In keeping with tradition, the boys and girls who made their First Holy Communion and Confirmation this year were given pride of place at the front of the procession. It was lovely to see so many of the children dressed up in their finery, strewing petals while leading the procession of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Procession was a spectacle to behold. Led by a traditional religious banner followed by four Mass servers carrying a Cross, two candles and a thurible with the First Communion and Confirmation children being followed by the Blessed Sacrament sheltered under a golden canopy. As the Procession made its way the 300 yards to the Abbey we recited the Rosary and Benediction was offered from the flower adorned ancient altar in the Abbey.

Carrying the Blessed Sacrament from the Old Cemetery to the Abbey it struck me that most of the children, as indeed many of their parents, would never have experienced nor been part of a Corpus Christi Procession before. The age-old ritual of processing with the Blessed Sacrament and of receiving Benediction, must have seemed strangely odd to their modern and predominantly secular sensitivities. What did they make of the whole experience? I am not sure.

My hope is that an experience such as our Corpus Christi Procession might reawaken not just in the children, but in all of us, a sense of the Holy. That, being part of such an powerful ritual might evoke from us an awareness of the transcendent, a sense that that there is something greater than us, an appreciation that somethings are better experienced rather than explained.

We live in a very secular world, a world which is perhaps is in danger of losing its sense of the Holy. Occasions such as the annual Corpus Christi procession are an opportunity for us to reawaken in ourselves the 'Idea of the Holy', they are an occasion when we experience once again that sense of being in the presence of the sacred, of being in the presence of God.
