

While we are all aware of the limitations of the current situation and the risk and danger that C19 continues to present to each and every one of us. None the less life can and must continue even if with limitations. This Year there will be No CHRISTMAS CONFESSIONS: A Message from POPE FRANCIS

Many people today would tell me, "Father, where can I find a priest, a confessor, because I can't leave the house? And I want to make peace with the Lord. I want him to embrace me. I want the Father's embrace.' The pope said his response would be;

"Do what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says. It is very clear.

If you cannot find a priest to confess to, speak directly with God your father, and tell him the truth. Say, 'Lord, I did this, this, this. Forgive me,' and ask for pardon with all your heart." Make an act of contrition and promise God, "I will go to confession afterward, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to a state of grace with God."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, N. 1453, says: "When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called 'perfect' contrition of charity.

Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to include having recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible."

"As the catechism teaches, you can draw near to God's forgiveness without having a priest at hand. Think about it. This is the moment."
