Sleepless Nights

At various stages throughout my life I have had what I call 'recurring dreams'. Although I might well wake up startled, these recurring dreams are not nightmares just dreams - possibly brought on by anxiety.

When I was at college and doing exams, I would often dream that on the day of the exam I found that I had had studied the wrong material and that I was unable to answer any question on the paper. When I began driving I would sometimes dream that while driving downhill I suddenly discover that the breaks are not working and that I have to try and get the car to stop without them. As a priest I sometimes dream that I arrive at Mass only to find that I have forgotten my few words and have to try and 'wing it'.

Those kinds of dreams I suppose are common enough and even though they may cause me to wake from my sleep with a start they are not based on reality – I always had my study done, I keep the car in good shape and even if I did forget my few words, after almost 35 years of priesthood I think I might just manage to 'wing it'.

But of late I am having a recurring dream which is based on reality – I dream that for one reason or another I can't get to Mass and the assembled congregation is left sitting there wondering what to do.

What would happen if on a Saturday night or Sunday morning the priest suddenly takes ill and can't get to Mass? What would happen if he has been called to an accident or an emergency and is unable to get back in time? What would happen if he has some unforeseen family emergency and is called away during the night? What would happen if the priest woke up on Sunday morning and found himself testing positive for Covid?

There was a time when in such an emergency another priest would step in, but the reality today is that there is no 'other' priest. What would happen? Would the congregation simply turn around and go home or could the congregation, having gathered, not wait and pray together without the priest?

Before Covid I was involved in the putting together of a short lay-led ritual; 'The Liturgy of the Word with the Distribution of Holy Communion'. The simple ritual is designed to be used in the event of a priest being unexpectedly unavailable to celebrate Mass. The ritual which is led by the Ministers of the Word and Ministers of the Eucharist assigned for that particular day, comprises of the day's readings, some Prayers of the Faithful and a rite for the distribution of Holy Communion.

During Lent we hope to introduce our Readers and Ministers of the Eucharist to the 'The Liturgy of the Word with the Distribution of Holy Communion' so that in the unlikely event that the priest is unable to be present for a scheduled Mass the congregation will be able to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word and will receive Holy Communion in a prayerful and structured way. The ritual will be available in each of the Churches should the need arise.

Being prepared for the unexpected absence of the priest is a good thing. Besides allowing me a more restful sleep(!), it also challenges us all to take greater responsibility for and ownership of the faith of our parish community and both encourages and empowers us to minster to each other.
