#### September 13th

September 13<sup>th</sup>. The date rang a bell but I was unsure why. Quickly I ran through family birthdays and anniversaries but no, it wasn't a family occasion to be remembered. Nor was it the 'expected delivery' date for anything ordered via the internet. Yet, September 13<sup>th</sup> certainly rang a bell.

Finally, it came to me. September 13<sup>th</sup>, 1981 was the date I entered the seminary in Maynooth. 41 years ago on that date I joined 77 first year students, all beginning their studies for the priesthood. Looking back it seems like a different world but my memories of the day are still crystal clear.

The night before, neighbours and family friends had called to wish me luck, even two classmates from boarding school called and gave me an engraved silver tankard to mark the occasion.

September 13<sup>th</sup>, 1981was a Sunday, so after Mass and the traditional Sunday family fry, with my suitcase packed away safely in the boot of the car I sat in behind my parents and we headed for Maynooth.

When we arrived Maynooth was a hive of activity with people milling around and families politely greeting each other from a distance. After registering I was shown to the room I would be sharing with a fellow student from the Tuam diocese. I had known my roommate in St Jarlath's and we were already close friends so whatever unease and anxiety we may have had quickly faded. In fact, of the five students who entered the seminary that day for our diocese three were from the same school.

Even though I had been in boarding school for the previous five years I distinctly remember saying goodbye to my parents, and although I had just turned seventeen, I somehow knew in that moment that that particular goodbye was different for all the other goodbyes we had said over the years. I also remember been struck by the variety of accents of my new classmates as I, for the first time met lads from Donegal to Cork and from Wicklow to Clare. Life in the Seminary was not much different than the life I had experienced in boarding school.

Although the food was considerably better and we enjoyed relatively greater freedom, seminary life for many of us was just an extension of secondary school.

Of the 77 young men (boys?) who started seminary with me on that day most were just out of secondary school. We didn't feel that we were being particularly courageous or taking a big step. In those days going to seminary wasn't unusual or exceptional. I for example already knew at least 3 or 4 seminarians ahead of me. In fact going to seminary at that time carried with it a certain respect and esteem.

I spent seven years in Maynooth studying for the priesthood. Over the years many of those who started out with me chose to follow other paths of life. When anyone left it was always a moment of reflection for those who continued. But with God's grace almost 40 of that initial 77 were ordained. Of the five who entered from our diocese three were ordained, each of whom still minister as priests. My first-year roommate left after five years but I am proud to say that we remain the greatest of friends. September 13<sup>th</sup> that's a date that rings a bell!
