PROPOSED SHRULE SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT DRAFT PLAN E - PUBLIC CONSULTATION:

A number of years ago a group was formed to explore the future development of Shrule NS and the surrounding properties associated with the school. These properties were 1. **Site A**: Tennis court & ball alleys; 2. **Site B**: School property currently leased to DES & 3. **Site C**: Current pitch beside Shrule NS, opposite the church. The purpose of the group was to explore and propose how these sites may be developed for use by the school and wider community.

The group formed compromised of representatives of various groups – BOM, teachers, Parents Association, local community and GAA. Following various meetings, discussions, and proposed drafts – the committee is now beginning the process of public consultation on the proposed plans (Draft E). Draft Plan E is now on display for public consultation in the porch of St. Joseph's Church, Shrule before the final draft is finalised.

The committee are seeking comments, views & suggestions. Please note that the committee intends to respond to comments etc so for them to be considered, it is necessary to include name and contact details. Comments can be left in writing in box provided and/or via email provided. If responses to queries are considered to be of interest to the general public, responses will be made public, but the name etc of person will not be included.

The aim is to have this part of the process completed by mid-September.

In advance thank you for your time and the committee is keen to hear from the community.

Please note the following regarding Draft E: Site A

Proposed Renovation of Ball Alleys & Tennis Courts

• To renovate ball alleys – plastering walls added in the 1980's & making secure.

OR

- To remove brick walls and restore ball alleys to original layout given historical & culture importance.
- Renovation of Tennis Courts resurfacing + lining & enclosing with new fence
- Removal of non-native trees, replaced with native trees & hedging.
- Removal of current boundary & replaced with new boundary.
- Lighting & cameras installed

Site B:

• Leased to DES – inclusion of extension is not part of proposed development. Its purpose is to identify where extension could go if one was necessary.

Site C:

- Include lane way along footpath to allow 1 way system for proposed car park.
- Removal of non-native trees, replaced with native trees and shrubs.
- Removal of current boundary, replaced with stone wall to incorporate new additional boundary around proposed new pitch.
- Lighting & cameras installed.
 Toilet facilities
 New pitch & school play area.

Comments:

- The committee has formed a limited company to secure public funding with the intention that it will lease it from the diocese. The directors of the company compromise of group representatives of committee.
- The faith community and parish/diocese will not be in any way responsible for financing this project and its upkeep in line with standard diocesan practices.
- It is the hope of the committee that funding will be secured via available sources of funding such as LEADER. This will require a community contribution via fundraising. The amount to be raised will depend on the overall cost of the project.
- Both Sites A & B primary function is to serve Shrule NS. This means that community access to the proposed facilities will be limited to outside of school hours.
- The limited company formed will have overall responsibility for the running & maintenance of Sites A & B.
- In arriving at these proposals, the committee explored various options such as drafts that
 include a proposed carpark on Site A. This was deemed not possible as there is no proper clear
 line of site on any proposed entrance/exit. The public are welcome to request these drafts via



May we walk one day When life is done Through the fields of Paradise Forever young Enfolded in your mystery


TODAY WE CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY INTO HEAVEN:

was some of my time. And now he has all my attention every single day.



"Chopin has always been my favourite, and my image would improve if people saw me playing the piano," replied Willis. "I'll play him."



The woman thought: "This is what You sent to help me?" However, she was desperate.


The man got off of his cycle and asked if he could help.
