ANTHONY, A MAN OF THE GOSPEL - SUNDAY 13th JUNE:

On 12th September, 1985 Pope Paul II visited the Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua. On that occasion, he said: 'Let me draw your attention straight away to that special quality which crops up repeatedly in the recorded events of this saint's life and which set him apart with limitless Christian holiness, throughout his whole life, Anthony, 'a man of the Gospel'.

In all Franciscan Churches throughout the world on this Sunday 13th June St. Anthony will be honoured on his feast day, 790 years ago on this day, Anthony died at the age of 36. For almost 800 years now people have

been seeking his intercession, to make representation on their behalf with God!

Anthony is known as the saint who finds things for us. All of us have lost something. I think of the many people who have lost:

- A) Hard earned money because of the financial recklessness of the few.
- B) Their homes
- C) Jobs with little hope and prospect for further employment.
- D) Parents who have lost a child in death through sickness, accidents or drugs.
- E) I think of people who are lost, who have taken a wrong road as a result of greed, reckless behaviour or sheer indifference.
- F) Those who have left the Church because of an issue or hurt by the Church and who now feel lost and are looking for a way back.

It is far easier to find a lost article than heal a lost or wounded person. Anthony's life and mission was to bring the message of Jesus to those who were lost, especially those seeking Jesus.

Popular devotion has nominated him as the finder of lost objects. Anthony found himself by losing himself totally to the providence of God.

THE FARMERS WELL: Once upon a time there was a very rich man named George sold a well to a poor farmer named Frank. Next day when Frank went to draw the water from the well George did not allow him to draw the water from it. He said, "Frank, I have sold you the well, not the water, so you cannot draw the water from the well." Frank became very sad as he needed the water for his livestock. Einstein: "By the way, what exactly the animal is?"


Mr. Bean then gives Einstein €1.

MONKS ON THE BEER: The Norbertine abbey, just north of Brussels, has resumed brewing beer after a gap of more than two centuries caused by invading French troops in the 1790s. The monks have opened a microbrewery on their premises to produce three varieties combining medieval recipes and modern techniques.

POPE FRANCIS: On 1 July, Pope Francis will welcome the main Christian leaders of address the Lebanon to "worrying" facing the crisis He has promised to country. visit Lebanon if its politicians



agree on a new government. The association of Catholic bishops in the European Union has urged the EU to support Lebanon.

MYANMAR MASSACRE:

Myanmar's military last week fired artillery shells at a Catholic Church in eastern Myanmar. Four civilians



died when the Sacred Heart Church in Kayanthayar Parish near Loikaw, the capital city of Kayah state, was targeted. All those killed and eight others wounded were Catholics.

MUGABE: The Catholic Church in Zimbabwe has added its voice to an escalating row over whether the remains of the late president, Robert Mugabe (pictured), should be exhumed and reburied. A traditional



chief last week ordered former First Lady Grace Mugabe to exhume her husband's remains at the family cemetery in Mashonaland West and rebury them in Zimbabwe's capital, Harare, at the National Heroes Acre cemetery by 1 July. A spokesperson for the Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference, Fr William Slattery, said that should the family decide to move the remains, prayers would need to be said by a priest before and after the exhumation.


