## Where there is a will...

I made my will last week. It was the first time I have made a will and the whole experience was very sobering indeed. The making of a will somehow makes incredibly real our own mortality.

Making a will is one of the things that the Diocese advises a priest to do as soon as he is ordained. I think the Diocese' concern is not so much that the priest will have his financial affairs in order but more that he make known any specific requirements he has around his funeral and burial arrangements. It was a piece of Diocesan advise which I successfully ignored until now.

As I waited for the solicitor to call me in, I wondered to myself why, after almost 35 years, I was finally about to do something I should have done long ago. Perhaps it's the age I'm at, maybe it's the troubled world in which we find ourselves or it might be simply because of my recent experience of my parents' deaths.

Certainly, as the executor of my parents' wills, I had experienced at first hand the value of having thought through what will happen after I die to whatever possessions I might have. There was a certain pride in me being able to fulfil my parents' requests even after they were gone. To know that I in some way was realising their final wishes meant a lot to me. But the realisation of their final wishes also meant a lot to my sisters and their families — not so much because of anything they might have been left, but because it meant my parents had 'remembered' them. It may seem like a small thing, but I think knowing that they are 'remembered' is hugely important and comforting to those who are left behind.

The making of a will urges us to consider who are the important people in our lives - who are the people we would like to 'remember'. For someone with a family the answer to that question might be obvious but for a priest, as a single person, it is not a question that I would consider too often.

Who we would like to remember is not the first question a solicitor asks when you are about to make a will. The first question the solicitor asks is what have you got to leave? In my case the answer to that question wasn't too difficult! In terms of monetary value, I won't be leaving much behind. But I would like to be remembered.

I would like to think that when I am gone the mention of my name will bring a smile to people's faces. That people might say that he was good to be around and that you left his company feeling better that you had met him. I would like to be remembered as someone who tried his best to live a good life, who often fell short but who never stopped trying. I would like to think that I made some small difference to people's lives and that by the way in which I lived my life others become open to the grace of God in theirs. On a personal note, I hope that my nephew and nieces will feel proud of their uncle and know that he loved them dearly.

My experience of making a will was a reminder to me of my own mortality. It made me stop and think not so much about what I might leave behind but more about how I'd like to be remembered. It's a work in progress. Where there's a will...
