



This weekend sees **public masses returning** in the Parish subject to the ongoing advice on public health and Social Distancing.

A number of Parishioners have volunteered to assist in organising the safe use of the churches. Everyone is asked to cooperate fully with the volunteers as they assist people's entry, seating and exit of the Church building.

We need more volunteers to assist with the stewarding in churches & the cleaning of the buildings.

For both churches the number of people who will be able to enter the Church will be limited. Admission will be based on a first come principle. The churches will be managed in relation to seating and people will be asked to be seated from the front to the back. Then to exit from the back to the front.

Saint Aidan's Room will be used as usual for Mass, but numbers will be limited.

All are asked to use the hand jell provided at the entrance to the Church.

Containers for church collections will be placed at the entrance to the church parishioners are asked to place their offering and envelopes in these as they enter. There will be no basket collection during Mass.

For those who cannot enter the church because of limited space Mass may be heard from outside the Church via the Public address system.

There will be no Mass Servers for the coming number of months.

To start with Holy Communion will not be distributed.

Holy water will not be available in the churches.

Votive candles will not be available immediately before or after Mass.

The toilets will not be available for use before, during or after Mass.

Baptism, Funerals, and Weddings will be celebrated over the coming months. No other public function will be organised in either church over the coming months.

Parish Newsletters will be available immediately after Mass and in the usual place during the week.

Anyone wishing to have an anniversary Mass for their deceased relatives and friends should do so in writing and place it in the church collection basket. Please provide your name and phone number. You may also book Masses by Phone, Text or E-mail.

As both Sacristies are small and it is not possible to practise recommended social distancing in them, all are asked to refrain from entering the Sacristy before or after Mass.

People should feel free to use gloves and or masks if they wish to wear them.

**Holy Communion** will be distributed to people starting next weekend 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> July. Communion will be distributed in the porch of the church **as people are leaving** at the end of mass.

**First Holy Communion** was to take place in May but had to be cancelled. Alternative arrangements will be made with the schools for new dates for First Communion once the students return to school. We keep these children in our prayers as they prepare for this Sacrament in the coming months.

If anyone is new to the Parish and would like to receive a box of envelopes or if anyone has been missed out on the list please contact the Priest. Thank you to all who have continued to provide financial support for the Parish over the past number of months.
