A Well Kept Secret

Our Church's Easter Ceremonies are perhaps the best kept secret of the Catholic Church. Full of ancient ritual and pageantry their richness and beauty are truly extraordinary and speak to our senses as much as they speak to our spirit. They are a spectacle which sadly only few experience and yet they are the most important and significant rituals of our Church.

Although it doesn't receive the same popular attention as Christmas, Easter is in fact the most sacred and holy time of the Church's year. During Holy Week we journey with Jesus from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, through his final meal with his followers and his night of torment in Gethsemane to his suffering and death on Calvary. But the Easter story doesn't end at Calvary. Our faith is not in the crucified Jesus, our faith is in the Risen Christ. The Easter story ends with the Easter proclamation that Jesus is risen and lives among us. It is our celebration of the Easter Ceremonies which in fact give us our identity as followers of the Risen Jesus. We are Easter people.

The liturgies which we will celebrate over the three days of Easter can be thought of as one single liturgy - the most ancient and solemn of all church liturgies.

On Holy Thursday at 7pm in Tiernaur we will gather to celebrate Mass of the Lord's Supper. As a faith community we remember the moment when Jesus gave us the great gift of the Eucharist and of the Priesthood. The ritual of the washing of the feet links in a dramatic way Eucharist and Priesthood to humble service of God in others.

No Mass is celebrated on Good Friday or Holy Saturday - the tabernacle remains empty. On Good Friday Stations of the Cross will be led in Tiernaur at 12noon and in Mulranny at 7pm. The Celebration of the Passion of Our Lord takes place in Newport Church at 3pm. On this sombre day of fast and abstinence we listen to and reflect on the depth of Jesus' love for us — a love which finds its ultimate expression in death on a cross, and we are invited to publicly venerate the cross.

The Vigil of Easter is the highlight of the Church's year. It begins by lighting a fire to honour Jesus as the Light of the world. The Paschal Candle is lit and we acclaim our faith that the darkness of this world can never overcome the light of Christ. The Easter Vigil will be held in Newport at 8pm on Holy Saturday. Dawn Mass of the Resurrection takes place on Easter Sunday Morning at 6.30am at Burrishoole Abbey.

The ceremonies of Holy Week are punctuated with deeply meaningful and significant moments; the washing of the feet on Holy Thursday, the veneration of the Cross on Good Friday, the lighting of the Paschal Fire and its procession through the darkened church on Holy Saturday night. These simple gestures are a physical affirmation of our faith in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But they are more than that. The ritual of the Holy Week ceremonies somehow draws us in and forms us in a way that stories and words can't. They are profound moments of experience which give us our identity as Catholic Christians. They not only make us who we are but they illuminate what we are.

At Easter we celebrate the central truth of our faith; Christ has died, Christ is Risen and Christ will come again. It's no secret!
