Christmas Masses

Throughout the Christmas period numbers allowed to be physically present to participate at Mass will be severely limited. Masses will be celebrated in each of our Churches but it will not be possible for everyone to attend.

Mass on Christmas Eve will be celebrated in Newport Church at 7pm and in Tiernaur Church at 9pm. Mass on Christmas Day will be celebrated in Newport Church at 10am and at 11.30am in Mulranny Church

7pm Mass on Christmas Eve will be our Parish Family Mass. Families and households of the parish are invited to gather in their homes around their kitchen table and to participate in Mass through parish radio or Facebook. As a sign of solidarity and a symbol of our unity we invite every family to light a candle and place it in the porch or on a windowsill of their home for the duration of the Mass.

The Parish will prepare a pack for each household which will include among other things a candle, some straw from the crib, a prayer card, something for the children and a little Christmas memento. Packs will be distributed through the schools and made available in the Churches. At the end of Mass each family will be invited to say a family prayer together uniting the whole parish in one voice. Mass will finish with the ringing of the church bells and households are encouraged to go to their door to ring a bell, announcing to each other and to the world the birth of Jesus.

Baby Jesus Sunday

Next Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, is the day we bless the Baby Jesus' of our Parish. Since numbers which attend Mass are restricted and families are unable to come to church you are invited to bring your Baby Jesus to the Church during the week and to leave in on the Sanctuary. The baby Jesus will be blessed at Masses next weekend and can be collected afterwards.

Reconciliation/Healing Service

Individual Confessions will not be possible this Christmas. A Parish Service of Reconciliation and Healing will be held via Facebook and Parish Radio on Monday December 21st at 7pm. The Service will allow us as a community and as individuals to explore where in our lives we are in need of healing and forgiveness and to seek God's comfort and implore God's mercy.
