#### **Putting Christmas Away**

I put away the parish church crib figures during the week. They form a motley crew. The ravages of time have taken their toll. The journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem seems to have left its mark on a very dishevelled looking Joseph. The flute playing shepherd has lost its flute and his mate is carrying a broken arm. One of the Wise Men has suffered a deep gash in his side – no doubt the result of a swordfight along the way and the aging one-eared donkey is beginning to look just a little forlorn (I wonder if he is related to the no-eared donkey in Tiernaur?)

There is something slightly sad about putting away Christmas for another year. We look forward to Christmas for so long and then suddenly it is all over. No sooner has the last of the crackers been pulled and the remaining Roses been scoffed than the Crib and the decorations seem strangely out of place. Like the tired and now half inflated birthday balloon still hanging around weeks after the birthday has been celebrated, the Christmas decorations quickly seem odd and weirdly inappropriate. And so back into the attic they go for another eleven months.

I'm not sure how old the crib figures are in any of our churches but I think it is true to say that they have seen a fair few Christmases at this stage. They could do with sprucing up and maybe even a dash of paint. Yet somehow their imperfection reminds us that that first Christmas was far from perfect. Mary had just given birth! (of all the figures in the crib she is the best kept and looks strangely serene after the ordeal), Joseph was flustered and tired after the journey, the shepherds came as they were — unprepared, the Wise Men must have looked strange and completely out of place and the animals were... animals, more than likely dirty and smelly. It was into that very chaotic and imperfect world that God chose to come as one of us.

I sometimes think that we have romanticized the Crib too much. We have made it cosy and perfect. We look at it and feel all warm and fuzzy inside... a bit like when we look at the decorated

shimmering Christmas tree or the smiling pleasantly plump Santy. It gives us that Christmas feeling.

The Crib does give us that Christmas feeling but it is much more than just another Christmas decoration. It reminds us of what we celebrate at Christmas. It tells us that God chose to come among us a vulnerable child, that God seeks to enter our imperfect world, that God meets and loves as we are and where we are. The Crib is the story of Christmas, but the story of Christmas is not just for Christmas – it is for everyday and for all year around.

Some people leave up their Crib throughout the year! Perhaps it reminds them that we are all called to seek out the Christ child in the least obvious of places and at the most unexpected of times. Perhaps it brings home to them that Christ is to be found in their ordinary and messy lives. Perhaps it highlights for them that God has a preference for the poor and flawed over the wealthy and outwardly perfect. Whatever its reason, leaving the crib out is a powerful declaration that the crib is much more than a decoration and that Jesus has a place in our homes – not just at Christmas.

Thank you to all involved in erecting our parish cribs. We look forward to seeing our motley crew of figures out again in a few months time!

Subject to the now all-too-familiar Covid caveats it is provisionally proposed to hold First Communion in Mulranny on the weekend of April 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> and in Newport on the weekend of May 14th/15th. The provisional date for our Parish Confirmation on Saturday March 12th.

Current infection rates in the community mean that our parish preparation programme for both Sacraments will not commence for the time being.
