Almost extinct. There are the usual ones of Shrove Tuesday, St. Brigit's Eve (a few people make straw crosses), Bonfire's night, St. Martin's Eve, Hallow E'en and St. Stephen's Day.

Usual superstitions of tying over chains on which coffin rests — taking longest route to granary and.
