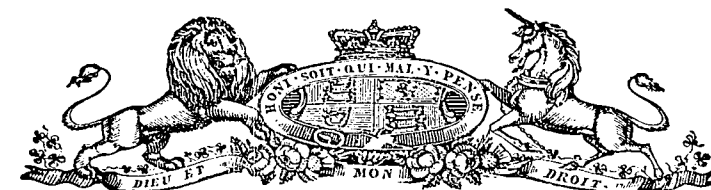

The Report of Guardians begs to state for the information of the Local Government Board for Ireland, in reply to their Letter of the 3rd instant, No. 29. 541/73, that although it was alleged that relieving officer Gorman had given the provisional relief out of his own shop as to apprehended, the fact was not proved, and it was denied by the relieving officer, and by the recipients of the relief, a Gray Esq. and Peter Joyce, who were present at the inquiry; it did however appear that the relieving officer in some instances, dispensed the provisional relief in money, instead of in kind, for which he was censured by the Guardians.

The Clerk laid before the Board copies of memorials to the Chief Secretary for Ireland from the Board of Guardians of Limerick Union, praying of the Chief Secretary to use his influence to obtain a refund from the Treasury, as in the case of Poor Law medical officers, of half of the amount paid to clerks of Unions in Ireland out of the Union Rates for their public duties, and of half the amounts paid by Boards of Guardians under the Vaccination and Registration Acts.

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It appears from the Return of Rates collected and not paid in the Union up to the 14<sup>th</sup> instant, that a sum of £1827. 15. 26 (principally due by large proprietors) remains uncollected at that date, although the warrants have been in the hands of the Collectors since the 6<sup>th</sup> of November last, — it also appears that no Rates have been collected in the Electoral Divisions of Ballinacorney and Duncannon, and that the collection made in the Electoral Divisions of Ballynecoy, Cappaghduff, Carrigrohane, and Keale's below the average collection in the other Electoral Divisions of the Union. It is therefore Resolved that Collectors Elliott and Grady be called upon to use the most active exertions to collect the outstanding Rates, and informed that the Board of Guardians will require their respective collections to be closed within the time limited in these Bonds.

Resolved that the Clerk be instructed to Advertise by printed handbill, and by advertisement in the "Ballinacorney Chronicle", and "Lloyd's Examiner" for Tenders for the following:—

- Workhouse supplies
- Repairs
- Medicines, &c. for workhouse and Dispensaries

Tenders to be considered at a Meeting of the Board of Guardians to be held on Thursday the 19<sup>th</sup> proximo.
