The lodge occupied by Maxwell when he lived in Ballycroo stood on the site of the lodge now owned by Mr Barra Ó Briain at ~~Sutton~~ Swahnamanough Bridge. The present home is of course a fairly recent structure with a slated roof. Maxwell's house had a thatched roof.

The river so lauded by Maxwell is the Swanduff which flows by the end of the lawn of Ó Briain's lodge.

Rock House, Claggan was once the residence of the Clives who were landlords of Ballycroo and who were relatives of the famous Clive of India.
