Knock Old Church: Situated in the village of Knock. The ruins consist of the lower portion of a 40 ft long, 7 ft high and approximately 3 ft thick. Near the west end is a door which is 5' 10" high and 3' feet wide, (see sketch). The founder of the church is not known, but according to tradition Prince Alfred of England is supposed to have founded it. Not under the care of the Office of Public Works. Free right of way to public.

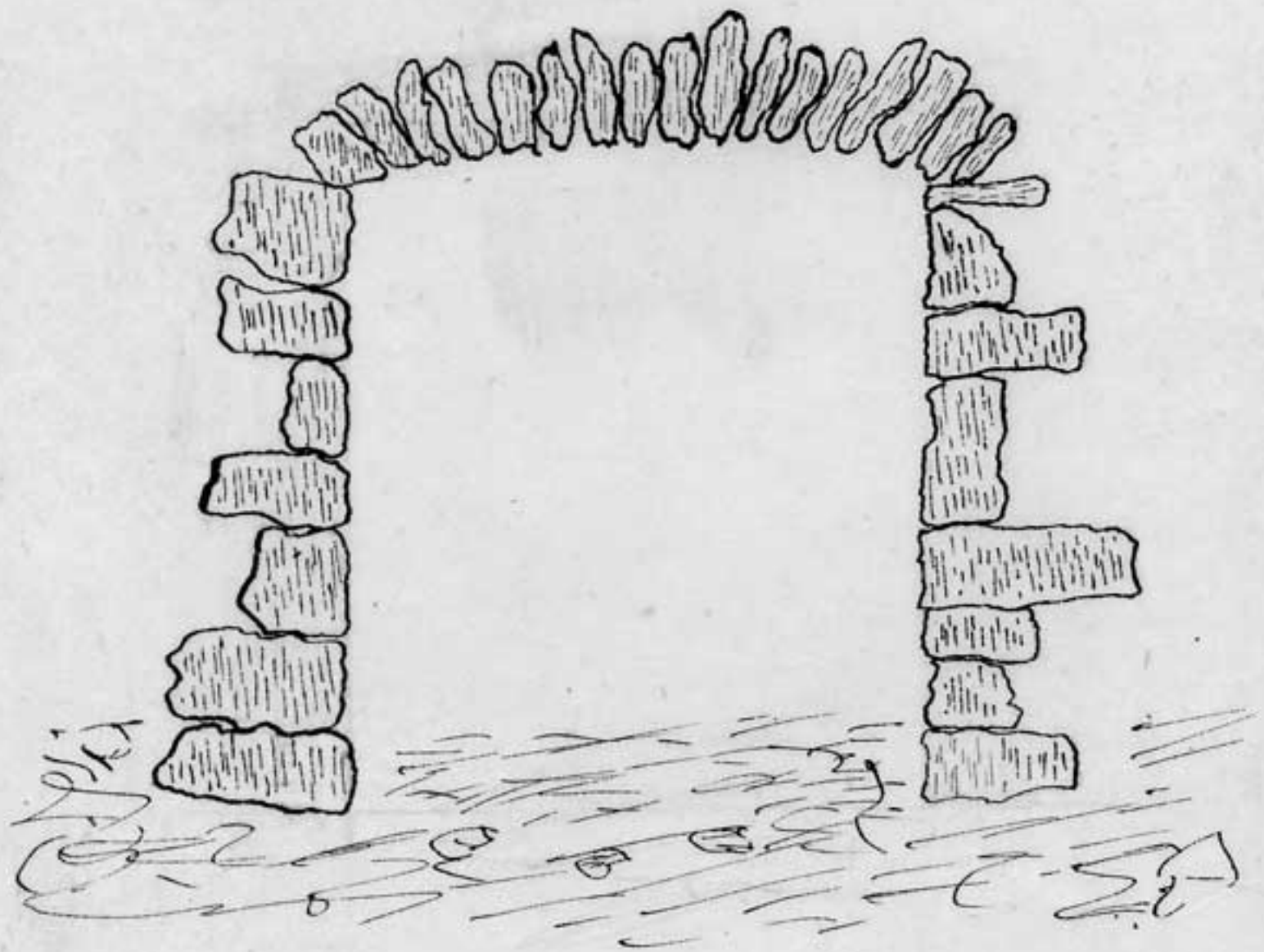
