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...of the workhouse, we cannot forget how his noble and gifted sister when in Ireland so creditably identified herself with this movement and did such priceless services in forwarding the good work. When Lady Betty Balfour, wife of our respected Chief Secretary, Mr. Gerald Balfour, was resident here some years ago, she interested herself greatly in this matter, and we believe it was largely owing to her and her husband that the cast-iron rules regarding the boarding out of Irish workhouse children were raised and a female inspector appointed by the Local Government Board. This a step in the right direction was taken which we are sorry has not under subsequent administrations been followed up by a more extensive and liberal use of the powers of boarding out until it resulted in the clearing out of the workhouses. But at any rate the guardians are free to use the privilege to the fullest extent and if they fail to do their duty and instead of looking after the poor children entrusted to their care, instead content themselves with empty oratory and idle, costly talk they thereby incur a grave responsibility and must answer for their breach of trust before Heaven. By neglecting to properly care up and educate those children entrusted to their care as guardians of the poor they are guilty before God and man of the most serious failure of duty and are in a degree accountable for all the bad consequences of this neglect. The observations of the recent Royal Commission on this grave subject are quoted by Lord Lytton and they well deserve repetition in their own words. In the most emphatic and honest words these experienced men in the light of the extensive investigations they made and the inquiries they conducted have left it upon record their opinion in these words:—

We call special attention to this point of the provision of children on our visits to workhouses, large and small, in town and country, in England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland. We saw hardly any workhouse on any terms in which the accommodation for children was at all satisfactory. We unhesitatingly agree with the Inspector of the Local Government Board who gave it to us as his opinion that 'no serious argument in defence of the

## The Proposed Waterworks for Ballinrobe. (COPY).

"To the Local Government Board, Custom House, Dublin.

"Gentlemen—A representative meeting of the ratepayers of Ballinrobe was held on the 24th July last, having for its object the procuring a supply of pure water for the use of the inhabitants of the said town. A deputation from the meeting waited on the Board of Guardians on the 29th July inst., when the consideration of the matter was adjourned for a fortnight for the attendance of a larger board. At the adjourned meeting held on the 12th August the board, without any reasonable cause, refused the application. This we, the undersigned ratepayers, consider a very great hardship, as we are willing to undergo the expense of the undertaking, and have already on three occasions within the last few years made similar applications and with like results.

"Now, as this is a matter of urgent necessity and vital importance to the residents of the town, we humbly ask your Board to have the action of the Board of Guardians inquired into, as it is evident we have nothing to expect at the hands of the Sanitary Authority, the members of which are mostly composed of tenant farmers living at a distance from the town, and consequently taking no interest in the requirements of the townspeople.

"That the want of a supply of pure water, and the dangerous consequences that may result from the use of the present polluted stream from which the people have to take their supply, have frequently been reported on by our present and former Medical Officers. Yet no steps have been taken to improve the position.

"We, the signatories to this memorial, respectfully request that your Board will send your Inspector to have inquiry made and evidence taken on the dire want of wholesome water from which two thousand inhabitants residing within the town are at present denied."

**INSURANCE ACT**

**UNION OFFICERS EXEMPT**

**A. FARREACHING**

The Master of the Rolls in the case submitted by the National Insurance Commission as to the position of officers of the South Dublin Union under the National Insurance Act, Section 17, of the Act, were granted leave until 17th of the month. The question raised in the case was one of the highest importance because it related not merely to the officers of the South Dublin Union, but the same to all the Poor Law Unions in Ireland. He had no power, he added, to make an order as to costs.

Boards of Guardians were empowered to employ into and execute certain functions for the relief of the destitute persons were imposed upon them by an order of the Commissioners. The supreme authority was still left with the Commissioners to whom the execution of the Act was entrusted. The number of officers to be appointed, the nature of their duties, their tenure of office and their salaries were to be fixed by the Guardians. But by the Commissioners. Further, it was contemplated by the Act that a paid officer might be an officer not merely of one Union, but of several Unions. All this seemed directly opposed to the idea of the usual relationship between master and servant. It was contended that the employees were not liable by the Boards of Guardians as an employer, a contractual liability, but they were chargeable as and payable out of the rates.

**CONTRACT OF SERVICE**

The learned judge cited several decisions in the Irish and English Courts in which it was held that there was no contract of service between Guardians and their officers as would govern the relationship of master and servant. He was of the opinion that such officers did not come within Part I of the National Insurance Act. That answered the general question submitted, but there were questions also submitted as to certain specific classes. They were divided into four classes. The first related to employees who had salaries of over £100 a year of salaries with emoluments who would bring their remuneration over £100 a year, and also any business, the sale of whose remuneration would be over £100 a year if averaged for the whole year. The answer was that this class did not come within Part I of the Act. The second class comprised nurses, the matron, apothecary, the schoolmistress, trained nurses, qualified nurses, wardmaids and attendants in the ordinary hospitals. His answer with reference to these was that they did not come under Part I of the Act, as they did not hold their office under a contract of service.

Class 3 comprised the assistants to the officers already mentioned, but as they were appointed under the same authority the answer was the same for the same reason. Class 4 comprised temporary nurses, wardmaids and attendants engaged by the master under Article 4 (F) of the Local Government Order. He had some difficulty in arriving at the same conclusion with reference to this class of case. But still these parties were not the same as the permanent officers, but as the Guardians were not entitled to fix their salaries, he must say that this class did not come within Part I of the Act.

Mr. BONAN, K.C., for the South Dublin Union officers, raised the question with reference to costs, and the Solicitor-General said they had obtained an order from the

# By the Local Government Board for Ireland. RULES AND REGULATIONS For the Regulation of Burial Grounds, &c.

To all Burial Boards having jurisdiction over Burial Grounds provided or which may be provided under the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878; To all Registrars, Clerks, and other persons having the care of such Burial Grounds; and to all persons whom it may concern.

WHEREAS, by "The Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Local Government Board for Ireland, from time to time, to make such rules and regulations, in relation to the Burial Grounds and places of reception of bodies previous to interment which may be provided under the said Act, as may seem proper for the protection of the public health and the maintenance of public decency, and for the proper registry of interments; and to provide for the imposition and recovery of penalties, not exceeding Ten Pounds for each offence for the breach or non-observance of such regulations.

NOW WE, the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in us by the said Act, or otherwise howsoever, do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall apply to all Burial Grounds provided, or which may be provided, under the said Act, that is to say—

**I.** Every Burial Ground shall be kept sufficiently fenced; and, if necessary, shall be underdrained to such a depth as will prevent water remaining in any grave or vault.

**II.** The area to be used for graves shall be divided into grave-spaces, to be designated by convenient marks, so that the position of each grave-space may be readily ascertained. A corresponding map or maps of the Burial Ground shall be constantly kept in some convenient place, at or near the Burial Ground, and shall be open to the inspection of all persons. On such map or maps every grave-space shall be shown, with its distinctive mark inscribed thereon.

**III.** The grave-spaces for the burial of persons above twelve years of age shall be at least nine feet long by four feet wide; and those for the burial of children under twelve years of age shall be at least six feet long by three feet wide.

**IV.** Each grave, when opened for the first interment therein, shall be sunk to the perpendicular depth of eight feet at the least; and every person interring a body in a grave not sunk to such depth shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

**V.** No interment shall be permitted in any Burial Ground, nor shall any dead body be admitted into any place of reception of bodies previous to interment, unless the body be enclosed in a coffin of wood or other sufficiently strong material. Any person presenting a body for interment in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

**VI.** One body only shall be buried in a grave at one time, unless the bodies of members of the same family; and every person interring any body in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

**VII.** No unwallied grave shall be re-opened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years of age, unless to bury another member of the same family, in which case a layer of earth not less than one foot in depth shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin; but if on re-opening any grave the soil be found to be offensive, such soil shall not be disturbed. In no case shall human remains be removed from the grave. Every person acting in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

**VIII.** No coffin shall be buried in any unwallied grave, unless the lid or upper surface thereof shall be sunk to a depth of at least four feet in violation of the ordinary level of the ground; and every person acting in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

**IX.** Any person unlawfully preventing, or attempting to prevent, the interment of any person in a Burial Ground, or unlawfully preventing or disturbing the celebration of funeral rites over any person, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.

**X.** Any person unlawfully preventing, or attempting to prevent, the interment of any person in a Burial Ground, or unlawfully preventing or disturbing the celebration of funeral rites over any person, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.

**I.** No grave, in which any body has been interred, shall be opened, save for the purpose of interment or the erection of a tombstone or headstone, without the written order of a Coroner or Justice of the Peace of the County, to be previously produced to, and left with, the Registrar. Any person violating this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Ten Pounds sterling.

**II.** No body, nor the remains of any body, shall be removed from one place of burial to another, or exhumed (except under the conditions set forth in Rule X) without a Licence from the Local Government Board, and with such precautions as such Board may prescribe as the condition of such Licence; and any person who shall remove or assist in removing any such body or remains contrary to this Rule, or who shall neglect to observe the precautions prescribed as the condition of the Licence for removal, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten Pounds sterling.

**III.** A proper Registry Book (hereinafter referred to as the Registry Book), made of parchment, or vellum, with strong binding and suitable printed pages, and ruled in columns, with proper printed headings, shall be constantly kept in some convenient place at or near the Burial Ground, and shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times; but no person, except the person having the care and management of the Burial Ground, and in these Rules called the Registrar, shall be permitted to write in the Registry Book save as hereinafter mentioned. A printed copy of these Rules shall be kept constantly affixed to the Registry Book.

Any Registrar refusing to give inspection of the Registry Book, as required by this Rule, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling; and any person whatever unlawfully writing in, defacing, altering, or mutilating the Registry Book, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.

**III.** Before the interment of any person in a Burial Ground, or before admission into such place of reception as aforesaid, the Registrar shall, after due inquiry as to the facts from some relative of the deceased, or from the person having the direction and management of the interment, cause an entry to be made in the Registry Book, in plain and legible characters, under its proper headings, and in numerical order of the Christian and Surname, time of death, sex, age, religious persuasion, and occupation or rank in life, of the deceased, together with his or her last place of residence, and condition, as whether "married" or "single," "widower" or "widow," or "the child of A. B.," &c. After the interment due entry shall be made, under its proper heading, of the distinctive mark of the grave; and the signature of the person having the management of the interment shall be affixed in the last column but one, in token of the accuracy of the foregoing statements; and such signature shall be attested by the signature of the Registrar, in the last column. WHEREAS, by "The Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Local Government Board for Ireland, from time to time, to make such rules and regulations, in relation to the Burial Grounds and places of reception of bodies previous to interment which may be provided under the said Act, as may seem proper for the protection of the public health and the maintenance of public decency, and for the proper regulation of interments; and to provide for the imposition and recovery of penalties, not exceeding Ten Pounds for each offence for the breach or non-observance of such regulations.

NOW WE, the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in us by the said Act, or otherwise howsoever, do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall apply to all Burial Grounds provided, or which may be provided, under the said Act, that is to say—

- I. Every Burial Ground shall be kept sufficiently fenced; and, if necessary, shall be underpinned to such a depth as will prevent water remaining in any grave or vault.
- II. The area to be used for graves shall be divided into grave-spaces, to be designated by convenient marks, so that the position of each grave-space may be readily ascertained. A corresponding map or maps of the Burial Ground shall be constantly kept in some convenient place, at or near the Burial Ground, and shall be open to the inspection of all persons. On such map or maps every grave-space shall be shown, with its distinctive mark inscribed thereon.
- III. The grave-spaces for the burial of persons above twelve years of age shall be at least nine feet long by four feet wide; and those for the burial of children under twelve years of age shall be at least six feet long by three feet wide.
- IV. Each grave, when opened for the first interment therein, shall be sunk to the perpendicular depth of eight feet at the least; and every person interring a body in a grave not sunk to such depth shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.
- V. No interment shall be permitted in any Burial Ground, nor shall any dead body be admitted into any place of reception of bodies previous to interment, unless the body be enclosed in a coffin of wood or other sufficiently strong material. Any person presenting a body for interment in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.
- VI. One body only shall be buried in a grave at one time, unless the bodies be those of members of the same family; and every person interring any body in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.
- VII. After due inquiry as to the facts from some relative of the deceased, or admission into such place of reception as aforesaid, the Registrar shall, before the interment of any person in a Burial Ground, or before the Registrar's Book (hereinafter referred to as the Registrar's Book), made of parchment, or vellum, with strong binding and suitable printed pagings, and ruled in columns, with proper printed headings, shall be constantly kept in some convenient place at or near the Burial Ground, and shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times; but no person, except the person having the care and management of the Burial Ground, and in these Rules called the Registrar, shall be permitted to write in the Registrar's Book save as hereinafter mentioned. A printed copy of these Rules shall be kept constantly annexed to the Registrar's Book.
- VIII. Any Registrar refusing to give inspection of the Registrar's Book, as required by this Rule, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling; and any person whatever unlawfully writing in, detaching, altering, or mutilating the Registrar's Book, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.
- IX. Before the interment of any person in a Burial Ground, or before admission into such place of reception as aforesaid, the Registrar shall, after due inquiry as to the facts from some relative of the deceased, or from the person having the direction and management of the interment, cause an entry to be made in the Registrar's Book, in plain and legible characters, under its proper headings, and in numerical order, of the Christian and Surname, time of death, sex, age, religious persuasion, and occupation or rank in life, of the deceased, together with his or her last place of residence, and condition, as whether "married," "single," "widower," or "widow," or "the child of A. B.," or "orphan." After the interment due entry shall be made, under its proper heading, of the distinctive mark of the grave; and the signature of the person having the management of the interment shall be affixed in the last column but one, in token of the accuracy of the foregoing statements; and such signature shall be attested by the signature of the Registrar, in the last column. Any such person wilfully refusing to give to the Registrar information as to the matters aforesaid, or to affix his signature as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.

AND WE, the Local Government Board for Ireland, in further pursuance of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the said Act, do hereby enjoin and require all Burial Boards, and all Registrars, Clerks, and other persons having the care of such Burial Grounds and places for the reception of dead bodies, strictly to conform to and obey these our Rules and Regulations, of which all persons concerned are directed to take notice, and which are to take effect from the day of the date hereof.

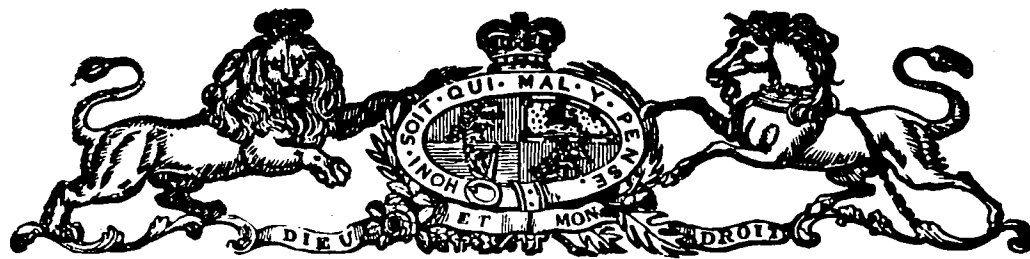

No unvaulted grave shall be re-opened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years of age, unless to bury another member of the same family, in which case a layer of earth not less than one foot in depth shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin; but if on re-opening any grave the soil be found to be offensive, such soil shall not be disturbed. In no case shall human remains be removed from the grave. Every person acting in violation of this Rule shall be liable to a penalty of Two Pounds sterling.

VI.

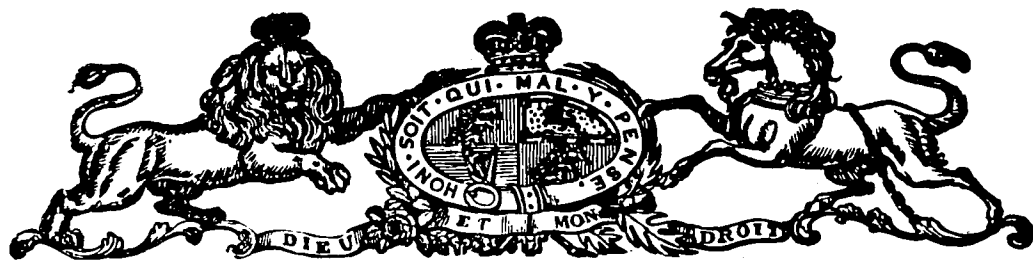

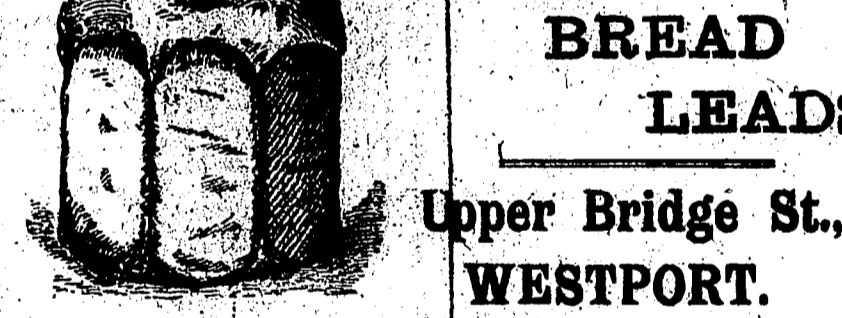
