A village which has some 40 households which lie to the sides of the village street, some 2.50 yds. long. A dozen houses are single-storey hatched. Others slated - one-storey and two-storey. Some of the buildings are neat and very cleanly kept. On a divergent road, near village street are the school-houses. The Prot. church is at southern street end - the Catholic church and priest's residences are a few hundred yards to the west.

St. Patrick's Church, nave, transepts and tower to west nave gable. Nave limestone. Altar gable window of 3 leafed lights with plain tracery over. nave south windows each of 3 round-headed lights, both of 2 lights rounded. transept gable apex of 2 leafed lights with plain tracery. transept doors plain. Tower has chamfered pointed entrance with pointed mould, in rectangular framework which is decorated by figures. all windows have pointed moulds with lighty decorated tracery.

KILMAINE VILLAGE. IMPORTANT PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

Holy Trinity Church: nave and chancel. 60' long and 24' wide. main entrance in porch off nave curtain. Painted, chamfered limestone. nave apex pointed lead, single light, chamfered. chancel has plain painted lights, chamfered. Vestry off chancel and has plain painted entrance and small painted lights in pairs. Steep pitched roof. Buttresses at all corners. brown limestone. (Erected 1860)
