

HISTORIC SITES

Royal Seats, scenes of historic events—battles, mass meetings, historic festivals, &c. Location.
Landowner. Historical or traditional notes.

Belliniske Castle — chief residence of the Mac Williams or Burke
overlord, captured by Tintern in 1570 and his submission of the
Burkes obtained. — In 1586 Sir Richard Bingham came to Belliniske
to parley with the Burke chiefs. The negotiations broke down and Bingham
hanged 6 hostages he held from the Burkes — three boys, aged 7, 9, and 14 years.
1592: Burkes attempted to regain their castle at Derryaggle but were heavily
defeated by Captain John Bingham and his men who are said to have slaughtered
12 women, each named Mary Burke. Their grave is located near the castle ruins.

(b) Right Rev. mensignor D'Alton, LL.D., M.R.I.A. Dean of the Chapter
of Tuam, Domestic Prelate (1921), P.P. of Belliniske 1911-1941, died
Jan. 25th 1941, and is buried in the grounds of St. Mary's Church,
Belliniske. — Born in Killulla (parish) Co. Mayo, educated at
St. Joseph's College, Tuam, and Maynooth College. Ordained 1887.
Member of Gov. Body Univ. College, Galway. Senator of Nat. Univ.
1914. Fellow of Royal Soc. of Antiquaries. Author of "A History
of Ireland from the Earliest Times to the Present Day" (1910/1924, 8 vols.)
"History of the Archdiocese of Tuam" (1928, 2 vols.) and various
articles in journals etc.

"History of Mayo" and "Notes on the Dioceses of Tuam, Achonry, and
Killala" — both by Knox. Mr. Knox was born in Belliniske and
his father was Colonel Knox of Creagh — the house later became
the present St. Theresa's Convent — much damaged by fire some
years ago.

Lord Tyrawley (James Cuffe) buried in Protestant cemetery i Belliniske. Died
SPAS OR MINERAL SPRINGS June 15th 1821. (There are antiquities...
Spas formerly in use. Location and present condition. Access. Right of way to public (Tyrone castle).
Mineral content and curative properties so far as known locally.
